A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to animal encounter training for peace officers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended 5 by adding Subsection (1) to read as follows: (1) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the 6 commission shall require an officer to complete an animal encounter 7 training program established by the commission under Section 8 9 1701.261. An officer shall complete the program not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under this 10 chapter or the date the officer applies for an intermediate 11 proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier. 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is 13 14 amended by adding Section 1701.261 to read as follows: 15 Sec. 1701.261. ANIMAL ENCOUNTER TRAINING PROGRAM. (a) The 16 commission shall establish a statewide comprehensive education and training program on animal encounters and animal behavior. The 17 training program must provide instruction in: 18 (1) handling animal-related calls or unplanned 19 encounters with animals, with an emphasis on canine-related 20 incidents and the use of nonlethal methods and tools in handling an 21 encounter; 22 23 (2) identifying and understanding animal behavior; 24 (3) laws and ordinances related to animals;

1 (4) avoiding an animal attack; and 2 (5) using nonlethal methods to defend against an 3 animal attack. 4 (b) At least once every three years, the commission shall 5 review the content of the training program under this section and 6 update the program as necessary. (c) Each officer who has not completed the training program 7 as required by Section 1701.253(1) shall complete the training 8 9 program not later than September 1, 2017. (d) Subsection (c) and this subsection expire January 1, 10 2019. 11 SECTION 3. Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, is amended 12 by adding Subsection (1) to read as follows: 13 14 (1) As a requirement for an intermediate proficiency 15 certificate, an officer must complete the animal encounter training program established by the commission under Section 1701.261. 16 17 SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt the rules necessary to 18 establish the animal encounter training program as required by 19 Section 1701.261, Occupations Code, as added by this Act. 20 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
