## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to electronic benefits transfer cards used for recipients
- 3 of benefits under certain assistance programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 531.0911 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 531.0911. PHOTOGRAPH ON CERTAIN ELECTRONIC BENEFITS
- 8 TRANSFER CARDS. (a) In this section:
- 9 <u>(1) "Financial assistance program" means the</u>
- 10 <u>financial assistance program established under Chapter 31, Human</u>
- 11 Resources Code.
- 12 (2) "Recipient" means a person who receives benefits
- 13 under the financial assistance program or the supplemental
- 14 nutrition assistance program.
- 15 (3) "Supplemental nutrition assistance program" has
- 16 the meaning assigned by Section 33.051, Human Resources Code.
- 17 <u>(b) The commission shall ensure that each electronic</u>
- 18 benefits transfer card used by a recipient, or other person
- 19 <u>authorized on the recipient's account, for purposes of receiving</u>
- 20 benefits under the financial assistance program or the supplemental
- 21 nutrition assistance program displays the name and photograph of
- 22 the recipient or other authorized person, as appropriate.
- SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Health and
- 24 Human Services Commission shall ensure that electronic benefits

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- 1 transfer cards used on or after that date to deliver benefits to
- 2 recipients under the financial assistance program under Chapter 31,
- 3 Human Resources Code, and the supplemental nutrition assistance
- 4 program under Chapter 33, Human Resources Code, conform to Section
- 5 531.0911, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 7 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 8 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 9 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 10 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 11 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
