## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to exempting books purchased, used, or consumed by
3	university and college students from the sales and use tax for a
4	limited period.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 151, Tax Code, is amended
7	by adding Section 151.3212 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 151.3212. BOOKS PURCHASED, USED, OR CONSUMED BY
9	UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE STUDENTS FOR LIMITED PERIOD. (a) The sale,
10	use, or consumption of a book is exempted from the taxes imposed by
11	this chapter if:
12	(1) the book is purchased by a full-time or part-time
13	student enrolled at an institution of higher education as defined
14	by Section 61.003, Education Code, or a private or independent
15	college or university that is located in this state and that is
16	accredited by a recognized accrediting agency as defined by Section
17	61.003, Education Code; and
18	(2) the purchase takes place during a period:
19	(A) beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the second Monday
20	in August and ending at 12 midnight on the second Sunday in
21	September; or
22	(B) beginning at 12:01 a.m. on January 1 and
23	ending at 12 midnight on January 31.

(b) A person may establish that the person is a full-time or

- 1 part-time student by presenting a valid student identification
- 2 card. The comptroller by rule shall prescribe the manner in which a
- 3 person may electronically establish, when making an online
- 4 purchase, that the person is a full-time or part-time student.
- 5 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not
- 6 affect taxes imposed before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 7 law in effect before the effective date of this Act is continued in
- 8 effect for purposes of the liability for and collection of those
- 9 taxes.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect July 1, 2015, if it
- 11 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 12 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 13 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that
- 14 date, this Act takes effect October 1, 2015.
