A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to eliminating certain state-required assessment
3	instruments and certain end-of-course assessment instruments
4	administered to public school students in certain grades.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective
7	until on or before September 1, 2015, is amended to read as follows:
8	(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
9	criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
10	essential knowledge and skills in reading, [writing,] mathematics,
11	$[social studies_{ au}]$ and science. Except as provided by Subsection
12	(a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
13	(b) or (l) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
14	(1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
15	seven without the aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid
16	of technology on any assessment instrument that includes algebra;
17	(2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;
18	(3) [writing, including spelling and grammar, in
19	grades four and seven;
20	[(4) social studies, in grade eight;
21	$[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$ science, in grades five and eight; and
22	(4) [(6)] any other subject and grade required by
23	federal law.
24	SECTION 2. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective

- 1 on or before September 1, 2015, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
- 3 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
- 4 essential knowledge and skills in reading, [writing,] mathematics,
- 5 [social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
- 6 (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
- 7 (b) or (l) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
- 8 (1) mathematics, in grades three and five without the
- 9 aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid of technology on
- 10 any assessment instrument that includes algebra;
- 11 (2) reading, in grades three, five, and eight; and
- 12 (3) [writing, including spelling and grammar, in
- 13 grades four and seven;
- 14 [(4) social studies, in grade eight; and
- 15 $\left[\frac{(5)}{}\right]$ science, in grades five and eight.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective
- 17 September 1, 2017, is amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
- 19 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
- 20 essential knowledge and skills in reading, [writing,] mathematics,
- 21 [social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
- 22 (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
- 23 (b) or (1) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
- 24 (1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
- 25 seven without the aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid
- 26 of technology on any assessment instrument that includes algebra;
- 27 (2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;

1 (3) [writing, including spelling and grammar, in

2 grades four and seven;

- 3 [(4) social studies, in grade eight;
- 4 $\left[\frac{(5)}{}\right]$ science, in grades five and eight; and
- $\underline{(4)}$ [$\underline{(6)}$] any other subject and grade required by 6 federal law.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 39.023(c), Education Code, is amended to 8 read as follows:
- 9 The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment 10 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, biology, English I, and English II[, and United States history]. The Algebra 11 I end-of-course assessment instrument must be administered with the 12 aid of technology. The English I and English II end-of-course 13 14 assessment instruments must each assess essential knowledge and 15 skills in both reading and writing in the same assessment instrument and must provide a single score. A school district shall 16 17 comply with State Board of Education rules regarding administration of the assessment instruments listed in this subsection. 18 student is in a special education program under Subchapter A, 19 Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and dismissal 20 21 committee shall determine whether any allowable modification is 22 necessary in administering to the student an assessment instrument required under this subsection. The State Board of Education shall 23 24 administer the assessment instruments. The State Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for the administration of 25 26 end-of-course assessment instruments that complies with the requirements of Subsection (c-3). 27

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- 1 SECTION 5. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 (c) In addition to the distinction designations described
- 4 by Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria
- 5 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction
- 6 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance in
- 7 academic achievement in English language arts, mathematics, $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 8 science[, or social studies].
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 10 school year.
- 11 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
