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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the essential knowledge and skills of the required 3 public school curriculum and to certain state-adopted or 4 state-developed assessment instruments for public school students. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by 7 adding Subsections (a-11), (a-12), (a-13), and (a-14) to read as 8 follows:

9 <u>(a-11) Before an assessment instrument adopted or developed</u> 10 <u>under Subsection (a) may be administered under that subsection, the</u> 11 <u>assessment instrument must, on the basis of empirical evidence, be</u> 12 <u>determined to be valid and reliable by an entity that is independent</u> 13 <u>of the agency and of any other entity that developed the assessment</u> 14 <u>instrument.</u>

15 (a-12) The agency shall ensure that an assessment 16 instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (a) is designed to primarily assess the essential knowledge and skills identified by 17 the State Board of Education under Section 28.002 of the subject and 18 for the grade level for which the assessment instrument is 19 administered. Only to the extent necessary or helpful for 20 diagnostic or reporting purposes, the assessment instrument may 21 also assess supporting knowledge or skills that are introduced or 22 23 referenced in the subject and for the grade level for which the assessment instrument is administered but that are identified as 24

No. 743 1 essential knowledge or skills primarily of a different subject or 2 for a different grade level. 3 (a-13) An assessment instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (a) must be designed so that: 4 5 (1) if administered to students in grades three through five, 85 percent of students will be able to complete the 6 7 assessment instrument within 120 minutes; and 8 (2) if administered to students in grades six through eight, 85 percent of students will be able to complete the 9 10 assessment instrument within 180 minutes. (a-14) The amount of time allowed for administration of an 11 12 assessment instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (a) may not exceed eight hours, and the administration may occur on only one 13 14 day. 15 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is amended by adding Sections 39.0236 and 39.0237 to read as follows: 16 Sec. 39.0236. STUDY OF ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS AND 17 ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS. (a) The agency shall conduct a study 18 19 regarding the essential knowledge and skills of the required curriculum identified by the State Board of Education under Section 20 28.002 and assessment instruments administered under Section 21 22 39.023. 23 (b) The study must evaluate: 24 (1) the number and scope of the essential knowledge and skills of each subject of the required curriculum under Section 25 26 28.002, with each essential knowledge or skill identified as a

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readiness or supporting standard, and whether the number or scope

2	(2) the number and subjects of assessment instruments
3	under Section 39.023 that are required to be administered to
4	students in grades three through eight; and
5	(3) how assessment instruments described by
6	Subdivision (2) assess standards essential for student success and
7	whether the assessment instruments should also assess supporting
8	standards, including analysis of:
9	(A) the portion of the essential knowledge and
10	skills capable of being accurately assessed;
11	(B) the appropriate skills that can be assessed
12	within the testing parameters under current law; and
13	(C) how current standards compare to those
14	parameters.
15	(c) Not later than March 1, 2016, the agency shall prepare
16	and submit to the State Board of Education a report concerning the
17	results of the study under Subsection (b). Not later than May 1,
18	2016, the State Board of Education shall review the study and shall
19	submit to the governor, each member of the legislature, and the
20	advisory committee established under Section 39.0237 the agency's
21	report and board recommendations regarding each issue evaluated
22	under Subsection (b).
23	(d) This section expires June 1, 2017.
24	Sec. 39.0237. ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO STUDY ESSENTIAL
25	KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS AND ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS. (a) An advisory
26	committee shall be established to review the agency study and State
27	Board of Education recommendations under Section 39.0236. The

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1	committee must be composed of:
2	(1) four members of the senate standing committee with
3	jurisdiction over public education appointed by the lieutenant
4	governor and four members of the house standing committee with
5	jurisdiction over public education appointed by the speaker of the
6	house of representatives;
7	(2) two members of the public appointed by the
8	lieutenant governor; and
9	(3) two members of the public appointed by the speaker
10	of the house of representatives.
11	(b) The advisory committee shall review the agency study and
12	State Board of Education recommendations under Section 39.0236. If
13	the advisory committee determines that the agency study is
14	insufficient, the advisory committee may perform an additional
15	independent study to evaluate the agency study components required
16	under Section 39.0236(b).
17	(c) Not later than January 1, 2017, the committee shall
18	prepare and submit to the governor, each member of the legislature,
19	the commissioner, and the State Board of Education a report that
20	includes, as applicable, the results of the committee's review of
21	the agency study or the results of the committee's independent
22	study and recommendations regarding each issue evaluated under
23	Section 39.0236(b).
24	(d) Based on the study under Section 39.0236(b) and the
25	advisory committee report under Subsection (c), the State Board of
26	Education shall adopt policies and procedures to limit the number
27	and scope of the essential knowledge and skills of each subject and

## 1 grade level to correspond with the readiness standards capable of being accurately assessed by applicable assessment instruments. 2 (e) This section expires June 1, 2017. 3 4 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 39.0381 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 39.0381. AUDITING AND MONITORING PERFORMANCE UNDER CONTRACTS FOR ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS. (a) The agency by rule shall 7 8 develop a comprehensive methodology for auditing and monitoring performance under contracts for services to develop or administer 9 assessment instruments required by Section 39.023 to verify 10 compliance with contractual obligations. 11 12 (b) The agency shall ensure that all new and renewed contracts described by Subsection (a) include a provision that the 13 agency or a designee of the agency may conduct periodic contract 14 compliance reviews, without advance notice, to monitor vendor 15 16 performance. 17 (c) The agency shall adopt rules to administer this section. SECTION 4. Section 39.053, Education Code, is amended by 18 adding Subsection (c-3) to read as follows: 19 (c-3) The indicator of student achievement under Subsection 20 (c)(1) may not include student performance as to supporting 21 knowledge or skills as described by Section 39.023(a-12). 22 23 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016 24 school year. SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 25 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 27

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
