BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

The Texas A&M Transportation Institute 5 SECTION 1. (a) assessing shall conduct а study the implementation 6 and 7 effectiveness of sound mitigation measures on highways that are part of the state highway system and toll roads or turnpikes under 8 the jurisdiction of a toll project entity as defined by Section 9 372.001, Transportation Code. The study must include: 10

(1) an analysis of the process and methodology used by the Texas Department of Transportation or toll project entity for selecting and implementing sound mitigation measures, including factors that affect the process and how outcomes are determined;

15 (2) an analysis of whether any kind of live testing is 16 conducted at any point to determine the actual traffic noise level 17 for neighboring properties;

(3) an evaluation of the effectiveness of the process
and methodology described by Subdivision (1) of this subsection in
reducing the traffic noise level for neighboring properties; and

(4) an evaluation of the effectiveness of implemented sound mitigation measures in reducing the traffic noise level for neighboring properties.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
