## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to inclusion of a civics test in the graduation
- 3 requirements for public high school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.025(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (c) A person may receive a diploma if the person is eligible
- 8 for a diploma under Section 28.0251. In other cases, a student may
- 9 graduate and receive a diploma only if:
- 10 (1) the student successfully completes the curriculum
- 11 requirements identified by the State Board of Education under
- 12 Subsection (a) and complies with <u>Sections 28.0259 and</u> [<del>Section</del>]
- 13 39.025; or
- 14 (2) the student successfully completes an
- 15 individualized education program developed under Section 29.005.
- 16 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 28.0259 to read as follows:
- Sec. 28.0259. CIVICS TEST. (a) The commissioner shall
- 19 adopt rules requiring a student in the foundation high school
- 20 program under Section 28.025 to be administered a civics test. A
- 21 student may not receive a high school diploma until the student has
- 22 performed satisfactorily on the civics test.
- 23 (b) The civics test is composed of all or a portion of the
- 24 questions on the civics test administered by the United States

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- 1 Citizenship and Immigration Services as part of the naturalization
- 2 process under the federal Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 3 Section 1101 et seq.).
- 4 (c) The commissioner by rule shall determine:
- 5 (1) the length and format of the test;
- 6 (2) the high school grade level or levels at which the
- 7 test may be taken; and
- 8 (3) the score that indicates satisfactory
- 9 performance.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with students who
- 11 enter the ninth grade during the 2015-2016 school year.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
