- 1 citizen's impaired mental condition to verify the condition as
- 2 required by Subsection (a)(2)(C) [(a)(2)(D)]; and
- 3 (2) as soon as practicable, determine whether the
- 4 senior citizen's disappearance poses a credible threat to the
- 5 senior citizen's health and safety for purposes of Subsection
- 6 (a)(3).
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
