A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of a joint interim committee to study and make recommendations regarding the 3 storage of biometric identifiers. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. INTERIM COMMITTEE; STUDY; REPORT. (a) A joint interim committee is created to study and review the methods by 7 which state agencies store biometric identifiers. 8 9 (b) The study must consider: (1) the level of security currently provided by state 10 agencies to biometric identifiers stored by the agencies; 11 12 (2) what changes, if any, should be made to ensure that 13 biometric identifiers are stored in a manner that provides the greatest level of security; and 14 (3) if the committee determines that an increase in 15 16 the level of security provided to biometric identifiers stored by state agencies is warranted, whether additional funds are necessary 17 to increase security to an acceptable level. 18 (c) The committee is composed of: 19 20 (1) three senators appointed by the lieutenant governor, one of whom the lieutenant governor shall designate as 21 cochair of the committee; and 22 23 (2) four state representatives appointed by the 24 speaker of the house of representatives, one of whom the speaker

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1 shall designate as cochair of the committee.

2 (d) The committee shall convene at least twice at the call3 of the cochairs.

4 (e) The committee has all other powers and duties provided 5 to a special or select committee by the rules of the senate and 6 house of representatives, by Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government 7 Code, and by policies of the senate and house committees on 8 administration.

9 (f) Not later than December 1, 2016, the committee shall 10 report the committee's findings and recommendations to the members 11 of the legislature. The committee shall include in its 12 recommendations specific statutory and rule changes that appear 13 necessary from the results of the committee's study.

14 (g) Not later than the 60th day after the effective date of 15 this Act, the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of 16 representatives shall appoint the members of the committee created 17 under this section.

(h) The Texas Legislative Council shall provide any
necessary staff and resources to the committee created under this
section.

21 SECTION 2. ABOLITION OF COMMITTEE. The committee is 22 abolished and this Act expires March 1, 2017.

23 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September24 1, 2015.

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
