A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the abolishment of the state lottery. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: ARTICLE 1. ABOLISHMENT OF STATE LOTTERY 4 5 SECTION 1.01. Section 467.002, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 467.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The commission is 7 subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in 8 9 existence as provided by that chapter, the commission is abolished and this chapter[, Chapter 466 of this code,] and Chapter 2001, 10 11 Occupations Code, expire September 1, 2025. 12 SECTION 1.02. Sections 467.024(a) and (c), Government Code, 13 are amended to read as follows: 14 (a) An individual is not eligible to be an appointed member of the commission if the individual: 15 is registered, certified, or licensed by 16 (1)а regulatory agency in the field of bingo [or lottery]; 17 18 (2) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more 10 percent interest in a business entity or other 19 than a 20 organization regulated by the commission or receiving funds from 21 the commission; 22 (3) is employed by or participates in the management 23 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or receiving funds from the commission; 24

1 (4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible 2 goods, services, or funds from the commission, other than 3 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for commission 4 membership, attendance, or expenses;

5 (5) is an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a
6 Texas trade association in the field of bingo [or lottery];

7 (6) is required to register as a lobbyist under
8 Chapter 305 because of the person's activities for compensation on
9 behalf of a profession related to the operation of the commission;

10 (7) is married to an individual described by 11 Subdivisions (2)-(6);

12 (8) has been convicted of a felony or of any crime13 involving moral turpitude; or

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(9) is not a citizen of the United States.

(c) A person may not be a commission employee employed in a "bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity," as that phrase is used for purposes of establishing an exemption to the overtime provisions of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 19 1938 (29 U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), if:

(1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of bingo [or 22 lottery]; or

(2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid
 consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of bingo [or
 lottery].

26 SECTION 1.03. Section 467.025(a), Government Code, is 27 amended to read as follows:

Sections 467.101(a) and (c), Government Code, 3 are amended to read as follows: 4 The commission has broad authority and shall exercise (a) 5 strict control and close supervision over all activities authorized and conducted in this state under [+ 6 7 [(1)] Chapter 2001, Occupations Code[; and 8 [(2) Chapter 466 of this code]. 9 (C) The commission also has the powers and duties granted under[+ 10 [(1)] Chapter 2001, Occupations Code[; and 11 [(2) Chapter 466 of this code]. 12 SECTION 1.07. 1 [(3) for compensation communicate directly with a member of the legislative branch to influence legislation on behalf 2 of a person that has a significant financial interest in the 3 lottery, before the second anniversary of the date that the 4 person's service in office or employment with the commission 5 6 ceases].

SECTION 1.08. Section 467.111(f), Government 7 Code, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (f) The commission shall prepare a report on the trends and issues identified under Subsection (e) and make the report 10 available to the public. The commission shall address the 11 identified trends and issues, including trends and issues related 12 to the regulation [of lottery operations under Chapter 466 and] of 13 14 bingo under Chapter 2001, Occupations Code.

15 SECTION 1.09. The following provisions of the Government Code are repealed: 16

SECTION 1.10. On January 1, 2016: 20

21 (1) the lottery division of the Texas Lottery Commission is abolished and all powers and duties of the division 22 23 related to lottery prize payments, penalties, enforcement 24 provisions, and any necessary continued operations under Chapter 466, Government Code, as it existed immediately before the 25 effective date of this Act, and other law are transferred to the 26 27 Texas Lottery Commission;

(2) all obligations, rights, contracts, bonds,
 appropriations, records, and property of the lottery division are
 transferred to the commission;

4 (3) a rule, policy, procedure, or decision related to
5 lottery prize payments, penalties, enforcement provisions, and any
6 necessary continued operations of the lottery division continues in
7 effect until superseded by a later act of the commission; and

8 (4) a reference in law to the lottery division means 9 the commission.

10 SECTION 1.11. (a) Not later than October 1, 2015, the Texas 11 Lottery Commission shall adopt a comprehensive transition plan for 12 the transfer described by Section 1.10 of this article and identify 13 any essential lottery division personnel necessary for the 14 continued payment of lottery prizes and assessment and enforcement 15 of penalties.

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(b) This section takes effect September 1, 2015.

17 SECTION 1.12. (a) Notwithstanding the repeal by this Act of Chapter 466, Government Code, that chapter as it 18 existed immediately before the effective date of this Act continues in 19 effect for the payment of lottery prizes and the assessment and 20 21 enforcement of penalties until each lottery prize and installment prize payment is made to the lottery prize winner entitled to the 22 23 payment and each penalty assessment is finally determined as 24 required by that chapter and rules adopted under that chapter as they existed immediately before the effective date of this Act. 25

(b) On or after the effective date of this Act, a lotterysales agent may not sell or offer to sell a lottery ticket for a

1 lottery game authorized under Chapter 466, Government Code, as 2 repealed by this Act.

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3 SECTION 1.13. The changes in law made by this article apply 4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 5 An offense committed before that date is governed by the law as it 6 existed on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is 7 continued in effect for that purpose.

10 (b) Criminal history record information obtained by the 11 commission under Subsection (a) [or (a=1)] may not be released or 12 disclosed to any person except on court order or as provided by 13 Subsection (c).

The changes in law made by this article apply 20 21 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before that date is governed by the law as it 22 existed on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is 23 24 continued in effect for that purpose. 25 ARTICLE 3. CONFLICT OF LAW; EFFECTIVE DATE 26 SECTION 3.01. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails over another Act of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 27

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1 2015, relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in 2 enacted codes.

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3 SECTION 3.02. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, 4 this Act takes effect January 1, 2016, but only if the 5 constitutional amendment proposed by the 84th Legislature, Regular 6 Session, 2015, abolishing the state lottery is approved by the 7 voters. If that amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act 8 has no effect.
