A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study and report regarding the use of open-source
3	instructional materials at public institutions of higher
4	education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 61.0666 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 61.0666. STUDY ON USE OF OPEN-SOURCE INSTRUCTIONAL
9	MATERIALS. (a) In this section, "open-source instructional
10	material" means electronic instructional material that is
11	available for downloading from the Internet at no charge to a
12	student and without requiring the purchase of an unlock code,

- 13 membership, or other access or use charge, except for a charge to
- 14 order an optional printed copy of all or part of the instructional
- 15 material.
- 16 (b) The board shall conduct a study regarding the use of
- 17 open-source instructional materials at institutions of higher
- 18 education. The study must include:
- (1) an analysis of any impact that the use of
- 20 open-source instructional materials has on the cost of other
- 21 <u>instructional materials;</u>
- 22 (2) any difference in the quality of content or effect
- 23 on the learning process between open-source instructional
- 24 materials and other instructional materials; and

- 1 (3) an evaluation of information from other states
- 2 that have implemented the use of open-source instructional
- 3 <u>materials at similar institutions regarding:</u>
- 4 (A) the benefits realized and costs incurred from
- 5 the use of those materials; and
- 6 (B) best practices for the use of those
- 7 materials.
- 8 <u>(c) Not later than September 1, 2016, the board shall submit</u>
- 9 to each legislative standing committee with primary jurisdiction
- 10 over higher education the results of its study under this section
- 11 and recommendations for legislative or other action.
- 12 (d) This section expires September 1, 2017.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
