H.B. No. 960

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the exemption of school district property from certain 3 infrastructure fees charged for the control of excess water or 4 storm water.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 580.003, Local Government Code, as 7 redesignated by Chapter 885 (H.B. 2278), Acts of the 80th 8 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, and amended by Chapters 1356 9 (H.B. 462) and 1430 (S.B. 3), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular 10 Session, 2007, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:

11 Sec. 580.003. EXEMPTIONS OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM 12 INFRASTRUCTURE FEES. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), no county, municipality, or utility district may collect from a state 13 agency, [or a] public or private institution of higher education, 14 or school district any fee charged for the development or 15 16 maintenance of programs or facilities for the control of excess water or storm water. 17

(b) A municipality with a population of 25,000 or less and
through which the Bosque River runs may collect from a state agency,
[or] public institution of higher education, or school district a
fee charged for the development or maintenance of programs <u>or</u> [of]
facilities for the control of excess water or storm water.

23 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not 24 affect fees imposed before the effective date of this Act, and the

1 law in effect before that date is continued in effect for the 2 purpose of the liability for and collection of those fees.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
