## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the purchase of iron, steel, and manufactured goods
3	made in the United States for certain state, state-aided, and
4	governmental entity construction projects.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 2166, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 2166.3031 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 2166.3031. UNIFORM PURCHASING CONDITION. (a) In this
9	section:
10	(1) "Component" means any article, material, or
11	supply, whether a manufactured good or a raw material, that is
12	directly incorporated into a manufactured good.
13	(2) "Manufactured good" means a product produced as a
14	result of a manufacturing process.
15	(3) "Manufacturing process" means the application of a
16	process to alter the form or function of the components of a product
17	in a manner that adds value and transforms the components into a new
18	finished product that is functionally different from a finished
19	product produced merely from assembling the components into a
20	product.
21	(4) "Produced in the United States" means:
22	(A) with respect to iron and steel products, a

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product for which all manufacturing processes, from initial melting

through application of coatings, occur in the United States, other

- 1 than metallurgical processes to refine steel additives; and 2 (B) with respect to manufactured goods, a 3 manufactured good for which: 4 (i) all of the manufacturing processes that 5 produced the manufactured good occur in the United States; and 6 (ii) more than 60 percent of the components 7 of the manufactured good, by cost, originate or are manufactured in 8 the United States. (b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(4)(B)(ii), if a 9 10 component originates in the United States, the entire cost of that component is included in the calculation under that subparagraph of 11 12 the percentage of the component costs for the manufactured good.
- (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), the uniform 13 14 general conditions for a construction project in which iron, steel, 15 or manufactured goods will be used must require that the bid documents provided to all bidders and the contract include a 16 17 requirement that the iron, steel, and manufactured goods used in the project be produced in the United States. 18
- 19 (d) Subsection (c) does not apply to a project for which the governing body of the governmental entity responsible for the 20 21 project determines that:
- (1) iron, steel, or specific manufactured goods are 22 not produced in the United States in sufficient and reasonably 23 24 available quantities and of a satisfactory quality; or
- 25 (2) inclusion of iron, steel, or specific manufactured 26 goods produced in the United States will increase the total cost of the iron, steel, or specific manufactured goods for the project by 27

- 1 more than 15 percent.
- 2 (e) This section applies to a project otherwise exempted
- 3 from the application of this chapter by Sections 2166.003 and
- 4 2166.004.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 2166.003(b), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Only Sections 2166.104, 2166.151, 2166.152, 2166.153,
- 8 2166.154, 2166.155, 2166.251, 2166.252, <u>and 2166.3031</u> and
- 9 Subchapter H apply to a construction project undertaken by or for
- 10 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice for the imprisonment of
- 11 individuals convicted of felonies other than state jail felonies.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 2166.3031, Government Code, as added by
- 13 this Act, applies only to bid documents submitted or contracts
- 14 entered into on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
