A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to publication of notice by a governmental entity on a newspaper's Internet website. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 2051.042(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) Except as provided by Section 2051.054, this [This] subchapter applies only to the extent that the general or special 8 9 law requiring or authorizing the publication of a notice in a newspaper by a governmental entity or representative does not 10 11 specify the manner of the publication, including the number of 12 times that the notice is required to be published and the period during which the notice is required to be published. 13 14 SECTION 2. Section 2051.045, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 Sec. 2051.045. LEGAL RATE CHARGED FOR PUBLICATION. (a) The 16 legal rate for publication of a notice in a newspaper is the 17 newspaper's lowest published rate for classified advertising. 18 (b) The legal rate for publication of a notice on a 19 newspaper's Internet website under Section 2051.054 may not exceed 20 \$25. 21 SECTION 3. Section 2051.051, Government Code, is amended to 22 23 read as follows:

24 Sec. 2051.051. BILL FOR PUBLICATION. (a) A newspaper that

1 publishes a notice shall submit a bill for the publication with a 2 clipping of the published notice and a verified statement of the 3 publisher that:

5 (2) certifies that the rate charged is the newspaper's
6 lowest published rate for classified advertising; and

states the rate charged;

7 (3) certifies the number and dates of the publication.
8 (b) A newspaper that publishes a notice on the newspaper's
9 Internet website under Section 2051.054 may electronically provide
10 to the governmental entity the bill, clipping, and verified
11 statement containing the information required under Subsections
12 (a)(1) and (3).

SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 2051, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 2051.054 to read as follows:

Sec. 2051.054. NOTICE BY PUBLICATION ON NEWSPAPER'S INTERNET WEBSITE. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a governmental entity may satisfy a requirement in another law for the governmental entity to provide publication of notice in a newspaper by publishing the notice on a newspaper's Internet website as provided by this section.

21 (b) A publication of notice on a newspaper's Internet
22 website must:

23 (1) be in substantially the same form as required 24 under the general or special law requiring or authorizing the 25 publication of notice in a newspaper by a governmental entity;

27 (A) for the number of times and during the period

1 the notice is required to be published under the general or special 2 law; or 3 (B) if the general or special law does not specify the manner of publication, as otherwise provided by this 4 5 subchapter; and 6 (3) comply with the requirements of this subchapter. 7 (c) To meet the eligibility requirements of section 8 2051.044 be eligible to provide publication of notice for governmental entity on the newspaper's Internet website under this 9 10 section, a newspaper must: (1) meet the requirements of Section 2051.044; 11 12 (12) establish an Internet-only option for publication of notice by a governmental entity; 13 14 (23) charge a reasonable fee not to exceed the legal 15 rate authorized by Section 2051.045(b) for the Internet publication 16 of notice; and 17 (34) establish an archive of the publications of notice posted on the newspaper's Internet website that allows free 18 19 public access to the current and archived publications of notice and that is searchable by keyword and county. 20 21 SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 2051, Government Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a publication of notice first 22 23 published on or after the effective date of this Act. A publication 24 of notice published before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time of the publication, and 25 26 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
