A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to money used by counties for the low-income vehicle
- 3 repair assistance, retrofit, and accelerated vehicle retirement
- 4 program and local initiative air quality projects.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 403.071(b), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) A claim may not be paid from an appropriation unless the
- 9 claim is presented to the comptroller for payment not later than two
- 10 years after the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation
- 11 was made. However, a claim may be presented not later than four
- 12 years after the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation
- 13 from which the claim is to be paid was made if the appropriation
- 14 relates to new construction contracts, to funding for local
- 15 initiative projects described by Section 382.220, Health and Safety
- 16 Code, that involve construction, to grants awarded under Chapter
- 17 391, Health and Safety Code, or to repair and remodeling projects
- 18 that exceed the amount of \$20,000, including furniture and other
- 19 equipment, architects' and engineering fees, and other costs
- 20 related to the contracts or projects.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 382.202(g), Health and Safety Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (g) The commission shall:
- 24 (1) use part of the fee collected under Subsection (e)

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- 1 to fund low-income vehicle repair assistance, retrofit, and
- 2 accelerated vehicle retirement programs created under Section
- 3 382.209; and
- 4 (2) [to the extent practicable,] distribute available
- 5 funding created under Subsection (e) among [to] participating
- 6 counties so that each participating county receives 90 percent of
- 7 the revenue derived from fees collected in the county [in
- 8 reasonable proportion to the amount of fees collected] under
- 9 Subsection (e) [in those counties or in the regions in which those
- 10 counties are located].
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 382.220, Health and Safety Code, is
- 12 amended by amending Subsections (b) and (d), as effective March 1,
- 13 2015, and adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 14 (b) A program under this section must be implemented in
- 15 consultation with the commission and may include a program to:
- 16 (1) expand and enhance the AirCheck Texas Repair and
- 17 Replacement Assistance Program;
- 18 (2) develop and implement programs or systems that
- 19 remotely determine vehicle emissions and notify the vehicle's
- 20 operator;
- 21 (3) develop and implement projects to implement the
- 22 commission's smoking vehicle program;
- 23 (4) develop and implement projects in consultation
- 24 with the director of the Department of Public Safety for
- 25 coordinating with local law enforcement officials to reduce the use
- 26 of counterfeit registration insignia and vehicle inspection
- 27 reports by providing local law enforcement officials with funds to

- 1 identify vehicles with counterfeit registration insignia and
- 2 vehicle inspection reports and to carry out appropriate actions;
- 3 (5) develop and implement programs to enhance
- 4 transportation system improvements, including improvements meant
- 5 to reduce congestion on existing roads, but not including toll
- 6 projects; or
- 7 (6) develop and implement new air control strategies
- 8 designed to assist local areas in complying with state and federal
- 9 air quality rules and regulations.
- 10 (d) Fees collected under Sections 382.202 and 382.302 and
- 11 distributed to a county under Section 382.209 may be used [in an
- 12 amount not to exceed \$7 million per fiscal year] for projects
- 13 described by Subsection (b). Only a county [, of which \$2 million
- 14 may be used only for projects described by Subsection (b)(4). The
- 15 remaining \$5 million may be used for any project described by
- 16 Subsection (b). The fees shall be made available only to counties]
- 17 participating in a program [the low-income vehicle repair
- 18 assistance, retrofit, and accelerated vehicle retirement programs]
- 19 created under Section 382.209 may receive money to implement a
- 20 project described by Subsection (b) [and only on a matching basis,
- 21 whereby the commission provides money to a county in the same amount
- 22 that the county dedicates to a project authorized by Subsection
- 23 (b). The commission may reduce the match requirement for a county
- 24 that proposes to develop and implement independent test facility
- 25 fraud detection programs, including the use of remote sensing
- 26 technology for coordinating with law enforcement officials to
- 27 detect, prevent, and prosecute the use of counterfeit registration

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- 1 insignia and vehicle inspection reports]. A county that receives
- 2 money for a project under this section may allocate money to
- 3 programs under Section 382.209 and this section at the discretion
- 4 of the county.
- 5 (e) Money used to implement a program under this section
- 6 that involves construction for a fiscal year may be distributed to a
- 7 county to be used for a program under this section in subsequent
- 8 fiscal years if the money has been made available to the county and
- 9 has been treated as a binding encumbrance by the commission before
- 10 the end of the appropriation year of the money appropriated for
- 11 those purposes. Distribution of the money is subject to Section
- 12 <u>403.071</u>, Government Code.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
