5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
7	amended by adding Articles 2.139 and 2.1395 to read as follows:
8	Art. 2.139. REPORTS REQUIRED FOR OFFICER-INVOLVED INJURIES
9	OR DEATHS. (a) In this article:
10	(1) "Deadly weapon" means:
11	(A) a firearm or any object manifestly designed,
12	made, or adapted for the purpose of inflicting death or serious
13	bodily injury; or
14	(B) any object that in the manner of its use or
15	intended use is capable of causing death or serious bodily injury.
16	(2) "Officer-involved injury or death" means an
17	incident during which a peace officer discharges a firearm causing
18	injury or death to another.
19	(b) The office of the attorney general by rule shall create
20	a written and electronic form for the reporting by law enforcement
21	agencies of an officer-involved injury or death. The form must
22	include spaces to report only the following information:
23	(1) the date on which the incident occurred;
2.4	(2) the leastion where the incident accurred

1 (3) the age, gender, and race or ethnicity of each peace officer involved in the incident; 2 3 (4) if known, the age, gender, and race or ethnicity of each injured or deceased person involved in the incident; 4 5 (5) whether the person was injured or died as a result 6 of the incident; 7 (6) whether each injured or deceased person used, 8 exhibited, or was carrying a deadly weapon during the incident; 9 (7) whether each peace officer involved in the incident was on duty during the incident; 10 (8) whether each peace officer involved in the 11 12 incident was responding to an emergency call or a request for assistance and, if so, whether the officer responded to that call or 13 14 request with one or more other peace officers; and 15 (9) whether the incident occurred during or as a result of: 16 17 (A) the execution of a warrant; or (B) a hostage, barricade, or other emergency 18 19 situation. (c) Not later than the 30th day after the date of an 20 officer-involved injury or death, the law enforcement agency 21 employing an officer involved in the incident must complete and 22 submit a written or electronic report, using the form created under 23 24 Subsection (b), to the office of the attorney general and, if the

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agency maintains an Internet website, post a copy of the report on

the agency's website. The report must include all information

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described in Subsection (b).

- 1 (d) Not later than the fifth day after the date of receipt of
- 2 <u>a report submitted under Subsection (c)</u>, the office of the attorney
- 3 general shall post a copy of the report on the office's Internet
- 4 website.
- 5 (e) Not later than February 1 of each year, the office of the
- 6 <u>attorney general</u> shall submit a report regarding all
- 7 officer-involved injuries or deaths that occurred during the
- 8 preceding year to the governor and the standing legislative
- 9 committees with primary jurisdiction over criminal justice
- 10 matters. The report must include:
- 11 (1) the total number of officer-involved injuries or
- 12 deaths;
- 13 (2) a summary of the reports submitted to the office
- 14 under this article; and
- 15 (3) a copy of each report submitted to the office under
- 16 this article.
- 17 Art. 2.1395. REPORTS REQUIRED FOR CERTAIN INJURIES OR
- 18 <u>DEATHS OF PEACE OFFICERS</u>. (a) The office of the attorney general
- 19 by rule shall create a written and electronic form for the reporting
- 20 by law enforcement agencies of incidents in which, while a peace
- 21 officer is performing an official duty, a person who is not a peace
- 22 officer discharges a firearm and causes injury or death to the
- 23 officer. The form must include spaces to report only the following
- 24 information:
- 25 (1) the date on which the incident occurred;
- 26 (2) the location where the incident occurred;
- 27 (3) the age, gender, and race or ethnicity of each

- 1 injured or deceased peace officer involved in the incident;
- 2 (4) if known, the age, gender, and race or ethnicity of
- 3 each person who discharged a firearm and caused injury or death to a
- 4 peace officer involved in the incident; and
- 5 (5) whether the officer or any other person was
- 6 injured or died as a result of the incident.
- 7 (b) Not later than the 30th day after the date of the
- 8 occurrence of an incident described by Subsection (a), the law
- 9 enforcement agency employing the injured or deceased officer at the
- 10 time of the incident must complete and submit a written or
- 11 electronic report, using the form created under that subsection, to
- 12 the office of the attorney general and, if the agency maintains an
- 13 Internet website, post a copy of the report on the agency's website.
- 14 The report must include all information described in Subsection
- 15 <u>(a)</u>.
- 16 (c) Not later than February 1 of each year, the office of the
- 17 attorney general shall submit a report regarding all incidents
- 18 described by Subsection (a) that occurred during the preceding year
- 19 to the governor and the standing legislative committees with
- 20 primary jurisdiction over criminal justice matters. The report must
- 21 <u>include:</u>
- (1) the total number of incidents that occurred;
- 23 (2) a summary of the reports submitted to the office
- 24 under this article; and
- 25 (3) a copy of each report submitted to the office under
- 26 this article.
- SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2015, the office of the

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- 1 attorney general shall create the reporting forms required under
- 2 Articles 2.139 and 2.1395, Code of Criminal Procedure, as added by
- 3 this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
