1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the classification of licensed massage therapy programs
- 3 as postsecondary education programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 455.203, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (e) and (f) to read as follows:
- 7 (e) The course of instruction in massage therapy provided by
- 8 <u>a licensed massage school is a postsecondary education program.</u>
- 9 (f) A massage school that provides instruction to persons
- 10 beyond the age of compulsory education is authorized to operate
- 11 <u>educational programs in massage therapy at the postsecondary level.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 13 455.203, Occupations Code, does not confer any new or additional
- 14 regulatory authority on the Department of State Health Services or
- 15 prescribe any new or additional requirements for massage schools
- 16 licensed under Chapter 455, Occupations Code.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
