- 2 relating to liability of food donors.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 76.004(a) and (c), Civil Practice and
- 5 Remedies Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A person or gleaner is not subject to civil or criminal
- 7 liability arising from the condition of apparently wholesome food
- 8 that the person or gleaner donates to a church, a not-for-profit
- 9 organization or a nonprofit organization for distribution to the
- 10 needy, if the food is apparently wholesome at the time of donation.
- 11 This subsection does not apply to an injury or death that results
- 12 from an act or omission of the donor constituting gross negligence,
- 13 recklessness, or intentional misconduct.
- 14 (c) A nonprofit organization is not subject to civil or
- 15 criminal liability arising from the condition of apparently
- 16 wholesome food that it distributes to the needy at no charge in
- 17 substantial compliance with applicable local, county, state, and
- 18 federal laws and rules regarding the storage and handling of food
- 19 for distribution to the public, if the food is apparently wholesome
- 20 at the time of distribution. This subsection does not apply to an
- 21 injury or death that results from an act or omission of the
- 22 organization constituting gross negligence, recklessness, or
- 23 intentional misconduct.
- 24 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

- 1 to the donation or distribution of food on or after the effective
- 2 date of this Act. The donation or distribution of food before the
- 3 effective date of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the
- 4 donation or distribution immediately before the effective date of
- 5 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
