SECTION 4. Section 124.004(b), Government Code, is 20 repealed.

SECTION 5. Article 102.0178, Code of Criminal Procedure, as amended by this Act, applies only to a cost on conviction for an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this

Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
