- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Article 17.292(c), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (c) The magistrate in the order for emergency protection may
- 9 prohibit the arrested party from:
- 10 (1) committing:
- 11 (A) family violence or an assault on the person
- 12 protected under the order; or
- 13 (B) an act in furtherance of an offense under
- 14 Section 42.072, Penal Code;
- 15 (2) communicating:
- 16 (A) directly with a member of the family or
- 17 household or with the person protected under the order in a
- 18 threatening or harassing manner; [or]
- 19 (B) a threat through any person to a member of the
- 20 family or household or to the person protected under the order; or
- (C) if the magistrate finds good cause, in any
- 22 manner with a person protected under the order or a member of the
- 23 family or household of a person protected under the order, except
- 24 through the party's attorney or a person appointed by the court;

- 1 (3) going to or near:
- 2 (A) the residence, place of employment, or
- 3 business of a member of the family or household or of the person
- 4 protected under the order; or
- 5 (B) the residence, child care facility, or school
- 6 where a child protected under the order resides or attends; or
- 7 (4) possessing a firearm, unless the person is a peace
- 8 officer, as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, actively engaged
- 9 in employment as a sworn, full-time paid employee of a state agency
- 10 or political subdivision.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
