A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to reimbursement under preferred provider benefit plans for services provided by licensed podiatrists. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 1301.062, Insurance Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 1301.062. PREFERRED PROVIDER CONTRACTS BETWEEN INSURERS AND PODIATRISTS. A preferred provider contract between an 8 9 insurer and a podiatrist licensed by the Texas State Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners must provide that: 10 11 (1)the podiatrist may request a copy of the coding 12 guidelines and payment schedules applicable to the compensation that the podiatrist will receive under the contract for services; 13 14 (2) the insurer shall provide a copy of the coding guidelines and payment schedules not later than the 30th day after 15 16 the date of the podiatrist's request; (3) the insurer may not unilaterally make material 17 retroactive revisions to the coding guidelines and payment 18 schedules; [and] 19 20 (4) the podiatrist may, practicing within the scope of the law regulating podiatry, furnish x-rays and nonprefabricated 21 orthotics covered by the health insurance policy; and 22 23 (5) the methodology used to compute the amount of 24 payment or reimbursement for services or procedures covered by the

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1 contract is the same as the methodology used to compute the amount 2 of payment or reimbursement when the services or procedures are 3 provided by a physician, including an osteopathic physician. 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

5 to a preferred provider contract entered into or renewed on or after 6 January 1, 2016. A contract entered into or renewed before January 7 1, 2016, is governed by the law applicable to the contract 8 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is 9 continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
