2	relating to the sale of fireworks on and before certain holidays.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2154.202(g), Occupations Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(g) A retail fireworks permit holder may sell fireworks only
7	to the public, and only during periods:
8	(1) <u>beginning February 25 and ending at midnight on</u>
9	March 2;
10	(2) beginning April 16 and ending at midnight on April
11	<u>21;</u>
12	(3) beginning the Wednesday before the last Monday in
13	May and ending at midnight on the last Monday in May;
14	(4) beginning June 24 and ending at midnight on July 4;
15	(5) [ $(2)$ ] beginning December 20 and ending at midnight
16	on January 1 of the following year; and
17	<u>(6)</u> [ <del>(3)</del> ] beginning May 1 and ending at midnight on
18	May 5 if the fireworks are sold at a location that is not more than
19	100 miles from the Texas-Mexico border and that is in a county in
20	which the commissioners court of the county has approved the sale of
21	fireworks during the period.
22	SECTION 2. Section 352.051(b)(1), Local Government Code, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	(1) The Texas Forest Service in the ordinary course of

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1 its activities shall determine whether drought conditions, as defined under Subsection (a)(2), exist on average in any county 2 3 requesting such a determination. The Texas Forest Service shall make available the measurement index guidelines used to determine 4 5 whether drought conditions exist in a particular area. Following any determination that such drought conditions exist, the Texas 6 Forest Service shall notify said county or counties when such 7 8 drought conditions no longer exist. The Texas Forest Service shall make its services available each day during the Texas Independence 9 Day, San Jacinto Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and December 10 fireworks seasons to respond to the request of any county for a 11 12 determination whether drought conditions exist on average in the 13 county.

SECTION 3. Section 352.051(d), Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

16 (d) To facilitate compliance with an order adopted under17 Subsection (c), the order must be adopted before:

18 (1) February 15 of each year for the Texas
19 Independence Day fireworks season;

20 (2) April 1 of each year for the San Jacinto Day
21 <u>fireworks season;</u>
22 (3) April 25 of each year for the Cinco de Mayo
23 fireworks season;

24 (4) May 15 of each year for the Memorial Day fireworks
25 season;

26 (5) [(2)] June 15 of each year for the Fourth of July 27 fireworks season; and

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H.B. No. 1150 1 <u>(6)</u> [<del>(3)</del>] December 15 of each year for each December 2 fireworks season.

3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
