## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to funding for public school career and technology
- 3 education programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 42.154(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) For each full-time equivalent student in average daily
- 8 attendance in an approved career and technology education program
- 9 in grades seven [nine] through 12 [or in career and technology
- 10 education programs for students with disabilities in grades seven
- 11 through 12], a district is entitled to:
- 12 (1) an annual allotment equal to the adjusted basic
- 13 allotment multiplied by a weight of 1.36 [1.35]; and
- 14 (2) \$50, if the student is enrolled in:
- 15 (A) two or more advanced career and technology
- 16 education classes for a total of three or more credits; or
- 17 (B) an advanced course as part of a tech-prep
- 18 program under Subchapter T, Chapter 61.
- 19 (c) Funds allocated under this section, other than an
- 20 indirect cost allotment established under State Board of Education
- 21 rule, must be used in providing career and technology education
- 22 programs in grades <u>seven</u> [nine] through 12 [<del>or career and</del>
- 23 technology education programs for students with disabilities in
- 24 grades seven through 12] under Sections 29.182, 29.183, and 29.184.
