A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to authorizing certain utility cost savings and 3 alternative fuel programs as eligible for local government energy 4 savings performance contracts.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 302.001(4), Local Government Code, is
amended to read as follows:

"Energy savings performance contract" means a 8 (4) 9 contract between a local government and a provider for energy or water conservation or usage measures in which the estimated energy 10 savings, utility cost savings, increase in billable revenues, or 11 12 increase in meter accuracy resulting from the measures is subject to guarantee to offset the cost of the energy or water conservation 13 14 or usage measures over a specified period. The term includes a contract for the installation or implementation of the following in 15 16 new or existing facilities, including all causally connected work:

17 (A) insulation of a building structure and18 systems within the building;

(B) storm windows or doors, caulking or weather stripping, multiglazed windows or doors, heat-absorbing or heat-reflective glazed and coated window or door systems, or other window or door system modifications that reduce energy consumption; (C) automatic energy control systems, including computer software and technical data licenses;

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heating, ventilating, or air-conditioning 1 (D) system modifications or replacements that reduce energy or water 2 3 consumption; 4 (E) lighting fixtures that increase energy 5 efficiency; 6 (F) energy recovery systems; 7 (G) electric systems improvements; 8 (H) water-conserving fixtures, appliances, and substitution of non-water-using fixtures, the 9 equipment or 10 appliances, and equipment; 11 (I) water-conserving landscape irrigation 12 equipment; (J) landscaping measures that reduce watering 13 14 demands and capture and hold applied water and rainfall, including: 15 (i) landscape contouring, including the use 16 of berms, swales, and terraces; and soil 17 (ii) the use of amendments that increase the water-holding capacity of the soil, including compost; 18 19 (K) rainwater harvesting equipment and equipment to make use of water collected as part of a storm-water system 20 21 installed for water quality control; 22 equipment for recycling or reuse of water (L) originating on the premises or from other sources, including 23 24 treated municipal effluent; 25 (M) equipment needed to capture water from 26 nonconventional, alternate sources, including air-conditioning condensate or graywater, for nonpotable uses; 27

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1 (N) metering or related equipment or systems that improve the accuracy of billable-revenue-generation systems; [or] 2 alternative fuel programs resulting in 3 (0)4 energy cost savings and reduced emissions for local government 5 vehicles, including fleet vehicles; 6 (P) programs resulting in utility cost savings; 7 or 8

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8 (Q) other energy or water conservation-related 9 improvements or equipment, including improvements or equipment 10 relating to renewable energy or nonconventional water sources or 11 water reuse.

12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
