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- 2 relating to the management of commercial oyster boat licenses
- 3 issued in this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 76, Parks and Wildlife
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Sections 76.405, 76.406, and 76.407 to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 76.405. LICENSE BUYBACK PROGRAM. (a) The department
- 9 shall implement a license buyback program for licenses issued under
- 10 this subchapter as part of the oyster license moratorium program
- 11 established by this subchapter.
- 12 (b) The commission by rule shall establish criteria, using
- 13 reasonable classifications, for the department's use in selecting
- 14 licenses to be purchased. The department or executive director
- 15 shall consult with the oyster license moratorium review board
- 16 concerning establishment of the criteria.
- 17 <u>(c)</u> The department shall retire each license purchased
- 18 under the license buyback program until the commission finds that
- 19 management of the oyster fishery allows reissue of those licenses
- 20 <u>through auction or lottery.</u>
- 21 (d) The department shall set aside an amount determined by
- 22 commission rule that is at least 20 percent of the fees from
- 23 licenses issued under this subchapter to be used only for the
- 24 purpose of buying back commercial oyster boat licenses from willing

- 1 license holders. That money shall be sent to the comptroller for
- 2 deposit to the credit of the game, fish, and water safety account.
- 3 (e) The department may solicit and accept grants and
- 4 donations of money or materials from private or public sources for
- 5 the purpose of buying back licenses issued under this subchapter
- 6 from willing license holders.
- 7 (f) Money to be used for the purpose of buying back licenses
- 8 <u>issued under this subchapter is not subject to Section 403.095</u>,
- 9 Government Code.
- 10 (g) The commission shall consider the social and economic
- 11 viability of the oyster industry and input from the oyster license
- 12 moratorium review board regarding the reissue of commercial oyster
- 13 boat licenses through auction or lottery.
- 14 Sec. 76.406. PREVAILING AUTHORITY. A proclamation of the
- 15 commission under this subchapter prevails over any conflicting
- 16 provision of this chapter to the extent of the conflict.
- 17 Sec. 76.407. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. (a) Not later than
- 18 November 1, 2018, the department shall report to the governor and
- 19 each member of the legislature an overview of the administration
- 20 and status of the oyster license buyback program, including the
- 21 biological, sociological, and economic effects of the program.
- 22 (b) This section expires September 1, 2019.
- 23 SECTION 2. The Parks and Wildlife Commission shall adopt
- 24 any rules required to implement this Act not later than June 1,
- 25 2016.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect June 1, 2016.
