A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requirements for construction and maintenance work
3	zones; creating an offense and altering a criminal penalty.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 472,
6	Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER C. [CRIMINAL OFFENSES AND PENALTIES REGARDING] WARNING
8	SIGNS, [AND] BARRICADES, AND TRAFFIC FLOW BARRIERS
9	SECTION 2. Sections $472.022(e)(2)$ and (3) , Transportation
10	Code, are amended to read as follows:
11	(2) "Construction or maintenance work zone" <u>has the</u>
12	meaning assigned by Section 541.402. [means a portion of a highway
13	or street:
14	[(A) where highway construction or maintenance
15	is being undertaken, other than mobile operations as defined by the
16	Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices; and
17	[(B) that is marked by signs:
18	[(i) indicating that it is a construction
19	or maintenance work zone;
20	[(ii) indicating where the zone begins and
21	ends; and
22	[(iii) stating: "Fines double when
23	workers present."]
24	(3) "Warning sign" means a signal, marking, or device

- 1 placed on a barricade or on a road, street, or highway during
- 2 construction, repair, or dangerous conditions by the department, a
- 3 political subdivision of this state, or a contractor or
- 4 subcontractor to warn or regulate motor vehicular traffic. The
- 5 term includes a flagger deployed on a road, street, or highway by
- 6 the department, a political subdivision of this state, or a
- 7 contractor or subcontractor to direct traffic around or on the
- 8 road, street, or highway during construction, repair, or dangerous
- 9 conditions. The term does not include a speed limit sign.
- 10 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 472, Transportation Code,
- 11 is amended by adding Section 472.023 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 472.023. TRAFFIC FLOW BARRIERS. (a) In this section:
- 13 <u>(1) "Concrete barrier" means a concrete obstruction</u>
- 14 placed on or across a road, street, or highway of this state.
- 15 (2) "Construction or maintenance work zone" has the
- 16 meaning assigned by Section 541.402.
- 17 (b) An entity, including the department, a political
- 18 subdivision, or a contractor or subcontractor, that establishes a
- 19 construction or maintenance work zone and directs the flow of
- 20 traffic into the opposite lane of travel shall install concrete
- 21 barriers to direct the traffic.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter E, Chapter 541, Transportation Code,
- 23 is amended by adding Section 541.402 to read as follows:
- Sec. 541.402. CONSTRUCTION OR MAINTENANCE WORK ZONE. In
- 25 this subtitle, "construction or maintenance work zone" means a
- 26 portion of a highway or street where highway construction or
- 27 maintenance is being undertaken, other than mobile operations as

- 1 defined by the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices,
- 2 that is marked by signs:
- 3 (1) indicating that the zone is a construction or
- 4 maintenance work zone;
- 5 (2) indicating where the zone begins and ends; and
- 6 (3) stating: "Fines double when workers present."
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 542.404, Transportation Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 542.404. FINE FOR OFFENSE IN CONSTRUCTION OR
- 10 MAINTENANCE WORK ZONE WHEN WORKERS PRESENT. (a) If Except as
- 11 provided by Subsection (c), if] an offense under this subtitle,
- 12 other than an offense under Chapter 548 or 552 or Section 545.366,
- 13 545.412, or 545.413, is committed in a construction or maintenance
- 14 work zone when workers are present and any written notice to appear
- 15 issued for the offense states on its face that workers were present
- 16 when the offense was committed:
- 17 (1) the minimum fine applicable to the offense is
- 18 twice the minimum fine that would be applicable to the offense if it
- 19 were committed outside a construction or maintenance work zone; and
- 20 (2) the maximum fine applicable to the offense is
- 21 twice the maximum fine that would be applicable to the offense if it
- 22 were committed outside a construction or maintenance work zone.
- 23 (b) <u>If a person violates a speed limit established</u>
- 24 under Section 545.366 in a construction or maintenance work zone
- 25 when workers are present, [In this section, "construction or
- 26 maintenance work zone" has the meaning assigned by Section 472.022.
- 27 [(c) The fine prescribed by Subsection (a) applies to a

- 1 violation of a prima facie speed limit authorized by Subchapter H,
- 2 Chapter 545, only if | the [construction or maintenance work] zone
- 3 is marked by a sign indicating the applicable maximum lawful speed,
- 4 and any written notice to appear issued for the offense states on
- 5 its face that workers were present when the offense was committed:
- 6 (1) the minimum fine applicable to the offense is
- 7 twice the minimum fine that would otherwise be applicable to the
- 8 offense; and
- 9 (2) the maximum fine applicable to the offense is
- 10 twice the maximum fine that would otherwise be applicable to the
- 11 offense.
- 12 SECTION 6. Subchapter H, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
- 13 is amended by adding Section 545.366 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 545.366. SPEED LIMIT IN CONSTRUCTION OR MAINTENANCE
- 15 WORK ZONE. (a) In a construction or maintenance work zone, the
- 16 speed limit is the lesser of:
- 17 (1) 20 miles per hour below the speed limit that would
- 18 normally apply to the highway or street under this subchapter; or
- 19 (2) 30 percent of the speed limit that would normally
- 20 apply to the highway or street under this subchapter.
- 21 (b) The entity responsible for posting speed limit signs on
- 22 the highway or street shall ensure that a construction or
- 23 maintenance work zone is marked by a sign indicating the applicable
- 24 maximum lawful speed.
- (c) This section does not apply to a construction or
- 26 maintenance work zone on a roadway that provides two-way movement
- 27 of traffic and is divided into three or more lanes in each

- 1 <u>direction</u>.
- 2 SECTION 7. Section 201.908, Transportation Code, is
- 3 repealed.
- 4 SECTION 8. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 8 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 9 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 11 before that date.
- 12 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
