- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 106.05(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A minor may possess an alcoholic beverage:
- 8 (1) while in the course and scope of the minor's
- 9 employment if the minor is an employee of a licensee or permittee
- 10 and the employment is not prohibited by this code;
- 11 (2) if the minor is in the visible presence of his
- 12 adult parent, guardian, or spouse, or other adult to whom the minor
- 13 has been committed by a court; [or]
- 14 (3) if the minor is under the immediate supervision of
- 15 a commissioned peace officer engaged in enforcing the provisions of
- 16 this code; or
- 17 (4) if the beverage is lawfully provided to the minor
- 18 <u>under Section 106.16</u>.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 106.06(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (b) A person may purchase an alcoholic beverage for or give
- 22 an alcoholic beverage to a minor if the person is:
- 23 (1) [he is] the minor's adult parent, guardian, or
- 24 spouse, or an adult in whose custody the minor has been committed by

- 1 a court, and [he] is visibly present when the minor possesses or
- 2 consumes the alcoholic beverage; or
- 3 (2) a person lawfully providing an alcoholic beverage
- 4 to a minor under Section 106.16.
- 5 SECTION 3. Chapter 106, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 106.16 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 106.16. EXCEPTION FOR CERTAIN COURSE WORK. (a) In
- 8 this section, "career school or college" means a career school or
- 9 college as defined by Section 132.001, Education Code, that offers
- 10 <u>a two-year associate degree as approved by the Texas Higher</u>
- 11 Education Coordinating Board.
- 12 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a minor may consume not
- 13 more than one ounce of wine per course meeting if:
- 14 (1) the minor:
- 15 (A) is at least 18 years old; and
- 16 (B) is enrolled as a student in a course at a
- 17 public or private institution of higher education or a career
- 18 school or college;
- 19 (2) the wine is consumed for educational purposes as
- 20 part of the curriculum for the course described by Subdivision
- 21 <u>(1)(B);</u>
- 22 (3) the wine is not purchased by the minor; and
- 23 <u>(4) the service and consumption of the wine is</u>
- 24 supervised by a faculty or staff member who is at least 21 years of
- 25 age.
- 26 (c) A public or private institution of higher education or a
- 27 career school or college is not required to hold a license or permit

- 1 to engage in the activities authorized under this section.
- 2 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 3 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 4 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 5 governed by the law in effect at the time the offense was committed,
- 6 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 7 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 8 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 9 before that date.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
