H.B. No. 1413

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the practice of therapeutic optometry. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 351.002(7), Occupations Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: "Practice of therapeutic optometry" means using 6 (7) objective or subjective means, [not] including surgery except as 7 prohibited under Section 351.4521 [or laser surgery], to: 8 9 (A) determine or measure the powers of vision of the human eye as provided by Section 351.355; 10 11 (B) examine or diagnose visual defects, abnormal 12 conditions, or diseases of the human eye or adnexa; 13 (C) prescribe or fit lenses or prisms to correct 14 or remedy a defect or abnormal condition of vision as provided by Section 351.356; 15 administer or prescribe a drug or physical 16 (D) treatment in the manner authorized by this chapter; or 17 18 (E) treat the visual system, including the eye or adnexa as authorized by this chapter. 19 SECTION 2. Sections 351.358(b) and (c), Occupations Code, 20 21 are amended to read as follows: 22 A therapeutic optometrist may: (b) 23 (1) administer, perform, or prescribe ophthalmic 24 devices, procedures, and appropriate medications administered by

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1 topical, subconjunctival, or oral means [, in accordance with this section and Section 351.3581,] to diagnose or treat visual defects, 2 abnormal conditions, or diseases of the human vision system, 3 including the eye and adnexa; or 4 5 (2) administer medication by parenteral means for a purpose and in a manner prescribed by Subsection (e). 6 7 A therapeutic optometrist may administer or prescribe (c) 8 oral analgesic medications only in the following classifications of oral pharmaceuticals: 9 10 (1)[one 10-day supply of oral antibiotics; [(2) one 72-hour supply of oral antihistamines; 11 12 [(3) one seven-day supply of oral nonsteroidal 13 anti-inflammatories; [(4)] one three-day supply of any analgesic medication 14 15 classified as a controlled substance under Schedule [identified in Schedules] III, IV, or [and] V of 21 U.S.C. Section 812; and 16 17 (2) one three-day supply of hydrocodone or of a hydrocodone combination medication classified as a controlled 18 19 substance under Schedule II of 21 U.S.C. Section 812 [(5) any other oral pharmaceutical recommended by the 20 Optometric Health Care Advisory Committee and approved by the board 21 and the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners]. 2.2 23 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 351.3581, Occupations 24 Code, is amended to read as follows: Sec. 351.3581. [DIACNOSIS AND] TREATMENT OF GLAUCOMA. 25 SECTION 4. Section 351.3581(a), Occupations Code, 26 is amended to read as follows: 27

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1 (a) A therapeutic optometrist may not administer or prescribe an oral or parenteral medication or treat glaucoma unless 2 3 the therapeutic optometrist holds a certificate issued by the A therapeutic optometrist certified under this section 4 board. 5 [subsection] shall be known as an optometric glaucoma specialist. To obtain a certificate, a therapeutic optometrist must [as 6 required under Section 351.165(c)]: 7 8 (1) complete an instructional clinical review course; 9 and 10 (2) pass an examination approved by the board.

SECTION 5. Section 351.4521, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 351.4521. PERFORMANCE OF <u>CERTAIN SURGICAL PROCEDURES</u> HA <u>BY THERAPEUTIC OPTOMETRISTS</u> [SURGERY] PROHIBITED. (a) A therapeutic optometrist may not perform <u>the following surgical</u> <u>procedures:</u>

17 <u>(1) retinal laser procedures, laser-assisted in situ</u> 18 <u>keratomileusis (LASIK), photorefractive keratectomy (PRK), or</u> 19 <u>laser epithelial keratomileusis (LASEK);</u>

20 (2) penetrating keratoplasty, corneal transplant, or
21 <u>lamellar keratoplasty;</u>
22 (3) a surgical procedure that requires the

23 administration of general anesthesia;

24 (4) intraocular injection;

25 (5) a surgical procedure relating to the removal of 26 the eye from a living person;

27 (6) a surgical procedure requiring full-thickness

1	incision or excision of the cornea or sclera other than
2	paracentesis in an emergency situation requiring immediate
3	reduction of the pressure inside of the eye;
4	(7) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
5	excision of the iris and ciliary body, including iris diathermy and
6	cryotherapy;
7	(8) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
8	excision of the vitreous;
9	(9) a surgical procedure requiring incision or
10	excision of the retina;
11	(10) surgical extraction of the crystalline lens;
12	(11) surgical intraocular implants;
13	(12) incisional or excisional surgery of the
14	extraocular muscles;
15	(13) surgery of the eyelid for a suspected eyelid
16	<pre>malignancy;</pre>
17	(14) surgery of the eyelid, including the incisional,
18	excisional, or mechanical repair of blepharochalasis,
19	dermatochalasis, or ptosis;
20	(15) tarsorrhaphy;
21	(16) surgery of the bony orbit, including orbital
22	<pre>implants;</pre>
23	(17) incisional or excisional surgery of the lacrimal
24	system other than lacrimal probing and related procedures;
25	(18) a surgical procedure requiring full-thickness
26	conjunctivoplasty with graft or flap;
27	(19) retrobulbar injection or injection into the

1	extraocular orbital space; and
2	(20) pterygium surgery [or laser surgery].
3	(b) This section does not prevent a therapeutic optometrist
4	from providing preoperative or postoperative care relating to a
5	surgical procedure listed in Subsection (a).
6	SECTION 6. The following provisions of the Occupations Code
7	are repealed:
8	(1) Section 351.358(d); and
9	(2) Sections 351.3581(b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g),
10	(h), (i), and (j).
11	SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
