A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to designation of an employee within certain state
- 3 agencies as a veteran's liaison.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 657, Government Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 657. VETERAN'S EMPLOYMENT PREFERENCES; VETERAN'S LIAISON
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 657, Government Code, is amended by
- 9 adding Section 657.011 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 657.011. VETERAN'S LIAISON. (a) In this section:
- 11 (1) "State agency" means a board, commission, council,
- 12 committee, department, office, agency, or other governmental
- 13 entity in the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of state
- 14 government, including an institution of higher education as defined
- 15 by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 16 (2) "Veteran" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 17 657.002(c).

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- 18 (b) Each state agency with more than 100 full-time
- 19 employees, using existing resources, shall designate a full-time
- 20 employee of the agency to serve as the veteran's liaison for the
- 21 agency.
- 22 (c) The veteran's liaison shall:
- 23 (1) stay informed on trends and developments in
- 24 hiring veterans for positions within the agency and of services

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- 1 available to veterans within and outside the agency;
- 2 (2) recruit veterans for open positions within the
- 3 agency; and
- 4 (3) serve as the contact for veterans within and
- 5 outside the agency to provide information about the agency and
- 6 veteran's employment and services available within and outside the
- 7 agency.
- 8 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2015, each state
- 9 agency with more than 100 full-time employees shall designate a
- 10 full-time employee of the agency to serve as the veteran's liaison
- 11 for the agency as required by Section 657.011, Government Code, as
- 12 added by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
