2	relating to the issuance of a license in this state to certain
3	physicians licensed outside of this state.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to improve health care
6	in this state by encouraging physicians to relocate to this state
7	and by providing for the expedited licensing of those physicians.
8	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 155, Occupations Code, is
9	amended by adding Section 155.010 to read as follows:
10	Sec. 155.010. LICENSING OF PHYSICIANS WITH CERTAIN
11	SPECIALTIES; RECIPROCITY. (a) This section applies only to an
12	applicant who is a physician licensed in a jurisdiction other than
13	this state and who holds a specialty certification recognized by
14	the board in one of the following areas:
15	(1) primary care;
16	(2) psychiatry;
17	(3) family practice;
18	(4) internal medicine;
19	(5) pediatrics; or
20	(6) obstetrics and gynecology.
21	(b) The board shall issue a license to an applicant
22	described by Subsection (a) who the board determines holds a
23	license issued by another jurisdiction that has licensing
24	requirements substantially equivalent to or more stringent than the

1 requirements of this state. 2 (c) The board shall issue a license to an applicant who holds a license issued by a jurisdiction with which this state has a 3 4 reciprocity agreement. The board shall enter into an agreement with another jurisdiction for the issuance of licenses by reciprocity to 5 6 applicants described by Subsection (a) if the other jurisdiction has licensing requirements that are substantially equivalent to or 7 more stringent than the requirements of this state. 8 9 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only

10 to an applicant for a physician license who submits an application 11 on or after January 1, 2016.

12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
