- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 659, Government Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 659.062 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 659.062. CHILD-CARE SUBSIDY PROGRAM. (a) A state
- 8 agency using money appropriated to the agency by this state may
- 9 establish a child-care subsidy program to assist the agency's
- 10 low-income employees with their child-care costs. The assistance
- 11 may be provided for full-time and part-time child care,
- 12 before-school and after-school programs, and daytime summer
- 13 programs.

- 14 (b) Two or more state agencies in a multitenant building may
- 15 establish a child-care subsidy program and share the program costs
- 16 to provide employees of the agencies with child-care services
- 17 through a child-care facility located in the building.
- 18 <u>(c) Except as prohibited under Subsection (d), a state</u>
- 19 agency may impose restrictions on the use of appropriated money for
- 20 its child-care subsidy program based on employees' needs, the
- 21 agency's staffing requirements, the local availability of child
- 22 care, and other factors determined by the agency, including
- 23 eligibility restrictions based on an employee's:
- 24 (1) full-time or part-time employment status;

- 1 (2) use of an on-site child-care facility;
- 2 (3) use of full-time child care; or
- 3 (4) use of child care in limited locations.
- 4 (d) A state agency that establishes a child-care subsidy
 5 program under this section may not limit the payment of subsidies to
- 6 only child-care facilities licensed by this state under Chapter 42,
- 7 <u>Human Resources Code</u>.
- 8 <u>(e) Subject to any restriction established under Subsection</u>
- 9 (c), an employee who qualifies as a low-income employee under a
- 10 state agency's child-care subsidy program is eligible to receive a
- 11 child-care subsidy for the care of each child under age 13 or, for a
- 12 child with a disability, under age 18.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
