A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to peer specialists, peer services, and the provision of
3	those services under the medical assistance program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 531.0999 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 531.0999. PEER SPECIALISTS. With input from peer
8	specialists, state-approved organizations that certify peer
9	specialists, and other relevant stakeholders, the commission shall
10	develop and the executive commissioner shall adopt:
11	(1) rules that establish training requirements for
12	peer specialists so that they are able to provide services to
13	persons with mental illness and services to persons with substance
14	use conditions;
15	(2) rules that establish certification and
16	supervision requirements for peer specialists;
17	(3) rules that define the scope of services that peer
18	specialists may provide;
19	(4) rules that distinguish peer services from other
20	services that a person must hold a license to provide; and
21	(5) any other rules necessary to protect the health
22	and safety of persons receiving peer services.
23	SECTION 2. Section 32.024, Human Resources Code, is amended
24	by adding Subsections (nn) and (oo) to read as follows:

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(nn) The commission in its rules and standards governing the
scope of services provided under the medical assistance program
shall include peer services provided by certified peer specialists
to the extent permitted by federal law.

5 (oo) The commission shall establish a separate provider 6 type for peer specialists for purposes of enrollment as providers 7 of and reimbursement under the medical assistance program.

8 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date 9 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 10 Services Commission shall adopt the rules required by Section 11 531.0999, Government Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall establish and implement a separate provider type for peer specialists as required by Section 32.024(00), Human Resources Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 5. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
