4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 773.122, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and (b-3) to read as
7	follows:
8	(b-1) The catastrophic emergency medical services account
9	is a dedicated account in the general revenue fund. Money from the
10	account may be appropriated only for the purposes of this section in
11	a situation in which the reserve described by Subsection (b) is
12	insufficient to cover costs.
13	(b-2) At the end of each fiscal year, the commissioner shall
14	deposit the unexpended balance of the reserve described by
15	Subsection (b) into the catastrophic emergency medical services
16	account.
17	(b-3) If at the end of a fiscal year the amount of money in
18	the catastrophic emergency medical services account, together with
19	the unexpended balance of the reserve described by Subsection (b),
20	exceeds \$2 million, the comptroller shall transfer any amount that
21	exceeds \$2 million to the supplemental emergency medical services
22	grant account under Section 773.1221.
23	SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 773, Health and Safety
24	Code, is amended by adding Section 773.1221 to read as follows:

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1	Sec. 773.1221. SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
2	GRANT ACCOUNT. (a) The supplemental emergency medical services
3	grant account is a dedicated account in the general revenue fund
4	into which money is deposited under Section 773.122(b-3).
5	(b) Money in the account may be used only to fund grants
6	under Section 773.119.
7	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
