3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 562.057 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 562.057. ADMINISTRATION OF EPINEPHRINE. (a) A
7	pharmacist may administer epinephrine through an auto-injector
8	device in accordance with this section.
9	(b) The board shall adopt rules designed to protect the
10	public health and safety to implement this section. The rules must
11	provide that a pharmacist may administer epinephrine through an
12	auto-injector device to a patient in an emergency situation.
13	(c) A pharmacist may maintain, administer, and dispose of
14	epinephrine auto-injector devices only in accordance with rules
15	adopted by the board under this section.
16	(d) A pharmacist who administers epinephrine through an
17	auto-injector device to a patient shall report the use to the
18	patient's primary care physician, as identified by the patient, if
19	the patient has a primary care physician.
20	(e) A pharmacist who in good faith administers epinephrine
21	through an auto-injector device in accordance with the requirements
22	of this section is not liable for civil damages for an act performed
23	in the administration unless the act is wilfully or wantonly
24	negligent. A pharmacist may not receive remuneration for the

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1 <u>administration of epinephrine through an auto-injector device but</u>
2 <u>may seek reimbursement for the cost of the epinephrine</u>
3 <u>auto-injector device.</u>

4 (f) The administration of epinephrine through an
5 auto-injector device to a patient in accordance with the
6 requirements of this section does not constitute the unlawful
7 practice of any health care profession.

8 SECTION 2. Before January 1, 2016, pharmacists may 9 administer epinephrine through an auto-injector device to the 10 extent allowed under the law that exists before September 1, 2015.

SECTION 3. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

(b) Section 562.057, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, takes effect January 1, 2016, except that Section 562.057 takes effect September 1, 2015, for the limited purpose of allowing the Texas State Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules under that law that may take effect before January 1, 2016.
