- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Government Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 45.194 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 45.194. GUADALUPE COUNTY. (a) In Guadalupe County the
- 10 county attorney of Guadalupe County shall perform the duties
- 11 imposed on and have the powers conferred on district attorneys by
- 12 general law and is entitled to be compensated by the state in the
- 13 manner and amount set by general law relating to the salary paid to
- 14 district attorneys by the state.
- 15 (b) The county attorney of Guadalupe County or the
- 16 Commissioners Court of Guadalupe County may accept gifts or grants
- 17 from any individual, partnership, corporation, trust, foundation,
- 18 association, or governmental entity for the purpose of financing or
- 19 assisting the operation of the office of county attorney in
- 20 Guadalupe County. The county attorney shall account for and report
- 21 to the commissioners court all gifts or grants accepted under this
- 22 subsection.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 43.112, Government Code, as amended by
- 2 Chapters 644 (H.B. 717) and 872 (H.B. 696), Acts of the 83rd
- 3 Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is repealed.
- 4 SECTION 4. On January 1, 2017, the office of district
- 5 attorney for the 25th Judicial District is abolished.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect January 1, 2017.
