## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to crowdfunding portal regulation for the purpose of small
3	business development.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The Securities Act (Article 581-1 et seq.,
6	Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes) is amended by adding Section 44 to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 44. CROWDFUNDING. (a) The Board shall adopt rules to
9	regulate and facilitate online intrastate crowdfunding.
10	(b) The Board shall adopt rules specific to authorized small
11	business development entities.
12	(c) In this subsection, "authorized small business
13	<pre>development entity" means:</pre>
14	(1) a Type A corporation authorized under Chapter 504,
15	Local Government Code;
16	(2) a Type B corporation authorized under Chapter 505,
17	Local Government Code;
18	(3) a nonprofit organization authorized by an agency
19	or authority of the federal government to distribute housing and
20	<pre>community development block grants;</pre>
21	(4) a municipality corporation; or
22	(5) the Texas Veterans Commission.
23	(d) The rules that are specific to authorized small business

development entities as defined by Subdivision (1) must:

- 1 (1) minimize any delay between raising and accessing
- 2 capital funds through crowdfunding;
- 3 (2) allow authorized small business development
- 4 entities to list offers in their web portals in which they are
- 5 financially interested;
- 6 (3) allow authorized small business development
- 7 entities and their portals to generally promote offers without
- 8 offering individualized investment advice;
- 9 (4) allow investors who purchase securities through
- 10 web portals operated by an authorized small business development
- 11 entity to have restrictions at least double the amount placed on
- 12 investors who purchase securities through web portals operated by a
- 13 non-authorized small business development entity;
- 14 (5) allow authorized small business development
- 15 entities to subcontract the operations of a crowdfunding web portal
- 16 to a third party; and
- 17 (6) limit the offerings of an authorized small
- 18 business development entity's web portal to the authorized small
- 19 business development entity's service area.
- 20 (e) The Board is allowed to create other requirements, as
- 21 they deem necessary by adopting rules.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
