## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the continuation and functions of the Governor's

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 115.005, Human Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 115.005. SUNSET PROVISION. The Governor's Committee
- 8 on People with Disabilities is subject to Chapter 325, Government
- 9 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
- 10 by that chapter, the committee is abolished and this chapter
- 11 expires September 1, 2027 [<del>2015</del>].
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 115.009, Human Resources Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 115.009. FUNCTIONS. The committee shall:
- 15 (1) serve as a central source of information and
- 16 education on the abilities, rights, problems, and needs of persons
- 17 with disabilities and, as necessary, issue reports;
- 18 (2) provide information to and advise the governor and
- 19 the governor's staff on matters relating to the full participation
- 20 of persons with disabilities in all aspects of life;
- 21 (3) before the end of each even-numbered year, submit
- 22 to the governor and to the legislature a report that includes [+
- [(A) the status of the state's compliance with
- 24 federal and state laws pertaining to rights and opportunities for

- 1 persons with disabilities and recommendations to achieve further
- 2 compliance, if necessary;
- 3 [(B) a long-range state plan for persons with
- 4 disabilities and recommendations to implement that plan; and
- 5 [<del>(C)</del>] any recommended changes in state laws
- 6 relating to persons with disabilities;
- 7 (4) serve as the state's liaison agency in working with
- 8 the Office of Disability [President's Committee on] Employment
- 9 Policy [of Persons with Disabilities] and other entities involved
- 10 in activities or concerns affecting persons with disabilities;
- 11 (5) develop and work with a statewide network of
- 12 volunteer community-level committees to promote dissemination of
- 13 information about and implementation of federal and state laws
- 14 addressing rights and opportunities for persons with disabilities;
- 15 (6) [evaluate the state's compliance with the federal
- 16 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Pub. L. No. 101-336) and
- 17 other federal and state statutes relating to rights and
- 18 opportunities for persons with disabilities;
- 19  $\left[\frac{(7)}{}\right]$  provide information and technical assistance to
- 20 public and private agencies and businesses to promote and
- 21 facilitate implementation of the [federal] Americans with
- 22 Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Section 12101 et seq.)[(Pub. L.
- 23 No. 101-336) and other federal and state statutes relating to
- 24 rights and opportunities of persons with disabilities;
- 25 <u>(7)</u> [<del>(8)</del> collect and evaluate data on employment of
- 26 persons with disabilities by state agencies;
- $[\frac{9}{9}]$  work with legislative committees and with state

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- 1 agencies on the development of laws and policies that affect
- 2 persons with disabilities;
- 3 (8)  $[\frac{(10)}{}]$  promote the compilation and publication of
- 4 state laws relating to persons with disabilities; [and]
- 5 (9) [\(\frac{(11)}{1}\)] issue awards and other forms of recognition
- 6 to persons and organizations making outstanding contributions to
- 7 the employment of persons with disabilities and to public awareness
- 8 of issues impacting persons with disabilities;
- 9 (10) identify each current long-range plan relating to
- 10 persons with disabilities in this state created by a state agency, a
- 11 committee of a state agency, or a nonprofit organization required
- 12 by federal law to produce such a plan, and publish the link to the
- 13 Internet website address for each long-range plan, if available, on
- 14 the Internet website of the Governor's Committee on People with
- 15 <u>Disabilities; and</u>
- 16 (11) review and analyze the long-range plans described
- 17 by Subdivision (10) to identify gaps in state laws and services for
- 18 persons with disabilities and make biennial recommendations in the
- 19 committee's report required under Subdivision (3) to address
- 20 identified gaps.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
