A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-20 relating to the continuation and functions of the Governor's 1-21 Committee on People with Disabilities. 1-22

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1**-**23 SECTION 1. Section 115.005, Human Resources Code, is amended to read as follows: 1-24

Sec. 115.005. SUNSET PROVISION. The Governor's Committee 1-25 on People with Disabilities is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided 1-26 1-27 by that chapter, the committee is abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2027 [2015]. 1-28 1-29

SECTION 2. Section 115.009, Human Resources Code, as amended by S.B. No. 219, Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is amended to read as follows: 1-30 1-31 1-32 1-33

Sec. 115.009. FUNCTIONS. The committee shall:
