- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 54.353(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) The governing board of an institution of higher
- 9 education shall exempt from the payment of tuition and laboratory
- 10 fees any student enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of
- 11 a fire science curriculum who:
- 12 (1) is employed as a firefighter by a political
- 13 subdivision of this state; or
- 14 (2) is currently, and has been for at least one year,
- 15 an active member of an organized volunteer fire department
- 16 [participating in the Texas Emergency Services Retirement System or
- 17 a retirement system established under the Texas Local Fire Fighters
- 18 Retirement Act (Article 6243e, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes) and]
- 19 who holds:
- 20 (A) an Accredited Advanced level of
- 21 certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the
- 22 State Firefighters' [Firemen's] and Fire Marshals' Association of
- 23 Texas volunteer certification program; or
- 24 (B) Phase V (Firefighter II) certification, or an

- 1 equivalent successor certification, under the Texas Commission on
- 2 Fire Protection's voluntary certification program under Section
- 3 419.071, Government Code.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 54.353(a), Education Code, as amended by
- 5 this Act, applies beginning with tuition and laboratory fees
- 6 charged for the 2015 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory fees
- 7 charged for an academic period before that semester are covered by
- 8 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act,
- 9 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
