1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of a state plan for Streptococcus 3 pneumoniae education and prevention. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Chapter 94A to read as follows: 6 7 CHAPTER 94A. STATE PLAN FOR STREPTOCOCCUS PNEUMONIAE; EDUCATION 8 AND PREVENTION PROGRAM 9 Sec. 94A.001. STATE PLAN FOR STREPTOCOCCUS PNEUMONIAE. (a) The department, using existing resources and programs to the extent 10 possible, shall develop a state plan for prevention and treatment 11 of diseases caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae. The plan must 12 include strategies for prevention and treatment of diseases caused 13 by Streptococcus pneumoniae in specific demographic groups that are 14 disproportionately affected by the diseases, including persons who 15 16 are elderly, children under two years of age, persons living in long-term care facilities, persons with a chronic heart or lung 17 disease, smokers, and persons with asplenia. 18 (b) In developing the plan, the department with the 19 assistance of the executive commissioner shall seek the input of: 20 (1) the public, including members of the public who 21 have had diseases caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae; 22 23 (2) each state agency that provides services to

24 persons infected with Streptococcus pneumoniae or the functions of

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1 which otherwise involve diseases caused by Streptococcus 2 pneumoniae, including any appropriate health and human services agency described by Section 531.001, Government Code, the Employees 3 Retirement System of Texas, and the Teacher Retirement System of 4 5 Texas; 6 (3) any advisory body that addresses issues related to 7 diseases caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae; 8 (4) public advocates concerned with issues related to vaccine-preventable diseases; 9 10 (5) providers of services to persons with diseases caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae; and 11 12 (6) a statewide professional association of 13 physicians. 14 (c) The department shall update the state plan developed 15 under this section at least once every five years and may update the 16 state plan biennially. 17 Sec. 94A.002. STREPTOCOCCUS PNEUMONIAE EDUCATION AND PREVENTION PROGRAM. (a) The department shall develop a program to 18 19 heighten awareness and enhance knowledge and understanding of 20 Streptococcus pneumoniae. 21 (b) The program developed under Subsection (a) must require 22 the department to: (1) conduct health education, public awareness, and 23 24 community outreach activities to promote public awareness and knowledge about the risk factors for, the value of early detection 25 26 of, available screening services for, and the options available for the treatment of diseases caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae; and 27
