2 relating to the qualifications of persons employed as nurses by

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.003, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a
- 9 person may not be employed by a school district as an audiologist,
- 10 occupational therapist, physical therapist, physician, [nurse,]
- 11 school psychologist, associate school psychologist, licensed
- 12 professional counselor, marriage and family therapist, social
- 13 worker, or speech language pathologist unless the person is
- 14 licensed by the state agency that licenses that profession and may
- 15 perform specific services within those professions for a school
- 16 district only if the person holds the appropriate credential from
- 17 the appropriate state agency. As long as a person employed by a
- 18 district before September 1, 2011, to perform marriage and family
- 19 therapy, as defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code, is
- 20 employed by the same district, the person is not required to hold a
- 21 license as a marriage and family therapist to perform marriage and
- 22 family therapy with that district.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a
- 24 person may not be employed by a school district as a nurse unless

- 1 the person holds a bachelor of science degree in nursing and is
- 2 licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing as a registered nurse. A
- 3 person employed by a district as a nurse before September 1, 2015,
- 4 who maintains a license issued by the Texas Board of Nursing is not
- 5 required to fulfill the requirements of this subsection in order to
- 6 remain employed as a nurse by that district or to be employed as a
- 7 nurse by another district.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
