5	SECTION 1. Subtitle Z, Title 3, Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 393 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 393. FEDERAL LAWS THAT VIOLATE BILL OF RIGHTS OF TEXAS

9	Sec. 393.001. POLICY. It is the policy of this state to
10	refuse to provide material support for, or to participate in the
11	execution or enforcement of, any federal law that the legislature
12	finds to violate the Bill of Rights of the Texas Constitution.
13	Sec. 393.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
14	(1) "Federal law" means any federal order, law,
15	policy, rule, mandate, or agency regulation.
16	(2) "Provision, penalty, or sanction" includes a
17	provision of federal law that provides a civil or criminal fine or
18	penalty, an administrative penalty, a tax, a surcharge, or a fee, or
19	for the suspension or revocation of a license, the suspension or
20	revocation of the authority to engage in business in this state, the
21	withholding or garnishment of a salary or wage, or any other action
22	or consequence under the law.
23	Sec. 393.003. LEGISLATIVE FINDING OF VIOLATION;
24	INTERPOSITION. (a) The legislature, by a two-thirds vote of all

- 1 the members elected to each house, may find that a federal law
- 2 violates Article I, Texas Constitution.
- 3 (b) The legislature may include in a finding under
- 4 Subsection (a) the manner in which the legislature may interpose
- 5 itself between the federal government and persons in this state to
- 6 oppose the federal government in the execution and enforcement of
- 7 the federal law.
- 8 Sec. 393.004. EXECUTION OR ENFORCEMENT OF FEDERAL LAW. A
- 9 state agency or political subdivision, or an officer or employee of
- 10 <u>a state agency or political subdivision</u>, may not execute or enforce
- 11 a provision, penalty, or sanction provided by a federal law that the
- 12 legislature has found under Section 393.003(a) to violate Article
- 13 <u>I, Texas Constitution</u>.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
