- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 253, Local Government Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Section 253.0125 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 253.0125. CONVEYANCE OF PROPERTY FOR ECONOMIC
- 8 DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES. (a) This section applies only to an entity
- 9 and a municipality that have entered into an economic development
- 10 agreement authorized by Chapter 380.
- 11 (b) Notwithstanding Section 272.001(a) or other law, a
- 12 municipality may transfer to an entity real property or an interest
- 13 <u>in real property for consideration described by this section.</u>
- 14 (c) Consideration for a transfer authorized by this section
- 15 is in the form of an agreement between the parties that requires the
- 16 entity to use the property in a manner that primarily promotes a
- 17 public purpose of the municipality relating to economic
- 18 development. The agreement must include provisions under which the
- 19 municipality is granted sufficient control to ensure that the
- 20 public purpose is accomplished and the municipality receives the
- 21 return benefit.
- 22 (d) Before making a transfer under an agreement as provided
- 23 by this section, the municipality shall provide notice to the
- 24 general public published in a newspaper of general circulation in

- 1 the county in which the property is located or, if there is no such
- 2 newspaper, in an adjoining county. The notice must:
- 3 (1) include a description of the real property,
- 4 <u>including its location; and</u>
- 5 (2) be published on two separate days within 10 days
- 6 before the date the property is transferred.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
