A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of a task force to examine the
- 3 effectiveness of school counseling programs in public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE ON PUBLIC SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAMS.
- 6 (a) A task force is established under this section to examine the
- 7 effectiveness of school counseling programs on student performance
- 8 in public schools.

- 9 (b) The task force is composed of the following 50 members
- 10 appointed by the commissioner of education:
- 11 (1) 20 school counselors;
- 12 (2) 10 individuals who serve on the board of trustees
- 13 of a school district;
- 14 (3) 10 superintendents;
- 15 (4) four representatives of regional education
- 16 service centers who have experience with school counseling;
- 17 (5) one representative of the State Board of
- 18 Education;
- 19 (6) one representative of the Texas Education Agency;
- 20 (7) two representatives of professional counseling
- 21 associations; and
- 22 (8) two representatives of research organizations
- 23 that have conducted academic studies on school counseling.
- 24 (c) In making appointments to the task force, the

- 1 commissioner of education must include members from the counties
- 2 that comprise the Texas-Mexico border area.
- 3 (d) The commissioner of education shall appoint the members
- 4 of the task force not later than December 1, 2015. The commissioner
- 5 shall fill a vacancy in the task force by the appointment of another
- 6 person with the same qualifications as the original appointee.
- 7 (e) The representative of the Texas Education Agency shall
- 8 serve as the presiding officer of the task force.
- 9 (f) The presiding officer shall call the initial meeting of
- 10 the task force on or before January 1, 2016. The task force shall
- 11 meet at the times and places that the presiding officer determines
- 12 are appropriate.
- 13 (g) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 14 task force.
- 15 SECTION 2. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. The task force shall:
- 16 (1) examine whether public schools are using school
- 17 counseling programs, including the national framework developed by
- 18 the American School Counselor Association;
- 19 (2) determine which school counseling programs
- 20 schools prefer to use; and
- 21 (3) conduct a statistical analysis, incorporating
- 22 information on student demographics, to determine the
- 23 effectiveness of school counseling programs and the impact on
- 24 student achievement and performance.
- 25 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2017, the
- 26 task force shall deliver a report to the commissioner of education
- 27 detailing the task force's findings and recommendations and the

- 1 results of the statistical analysis conducted by the task force.
- 2 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished, and
- 3 this Act expires, December 1, 2017.
- 4 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 5 1, 2015.
