A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to access of an adopted child to the adopted child's
- 3 biological siblings in certain circumstances.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 102, Family Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Section 102.0046 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 102.0046. STANDING FOR ADOPTIVE PARENT. The parent of
- 8 an adopted child may file an original suit requesting access to a
- 9 biological sibling of the child as provided by Section 162.024.
- 10 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 162, Family Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 162.024 to read as follows:
- Sec. 162.024. ACCESS TO SIBLINGS. (a) In this section:
- 13 (1) "Biological sibling" means a person with whom a
- 14 child shares a common birth parent.
- 15 (2) "Birth parent" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 16 162.402.

- 17 (b) The parent of an adopted child may file an original suit
- 18 to request access on behalf of the child to a biological sibling of
- 19 the child adopted by another person.
- 20 <u>(c) Subsection (b) applies only to the extent that a parent</u>
- 21 of an adopted child is aware of the existence of a biological
- 22 sibling adopted by another person and the identity of that person,
- 23 and does not entitle the parent to confidential information
- 24 regarding a biological sibling or adoptive parent.

- 1 (d) The court shall order reasonable access to the
- 2 biological sibling if the court finds that access is in the best
- 3 interest of both children.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 162.018, Family Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:
- 6 (c-1) The department, a licensed child-placing agency, or
- 7 another entity or person placing a child for adoption shall provide
- 8 the child's adoptive parent with any information known to the
- 9 department, agency, entity, or person that is not confidential
- 10 regarding the adoption of a biological sibling, as defined by
- 11 Section 162.024, of the child by another person.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
