- Sec. 32.351. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. (a) 8
- 9 commissioner shall establish a grant program under which a grant is
- awarded to a school district that has received a performance rating 10
- of D or F, as provided by Section 39.054, for the preceding school 11
- 12 year.

- (b) A school district may apply to the commissioner to 13
- participate in the grant program. In awarding grants under this 14
- subchapter for each school year, the commissioner shall consider 15
- 16 the availability of existing technological equipment to students in
- the district. 17
- (c) The commissioner may determine the terms of a grant 18
- awarded under this subchapter, including limits on the grant amount 19

- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
