Section 497.021, Government Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: 6 Sec. 497.021. AUTHORITY. This subchapter governs the sale 7 of prison-made products [to governmental agencies]. SECTION 2. Section 497.022, Government Code, is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 Sec. 497.022. CONTRACTS. The department may contract with: 10 11 (1) another state, the federal government, a foreign government, or an agency of any of those governments to manufacture 12 for or sell to those governments prison-made articles or products; 13 14 (2) a private or independent institution of higher 15 education to manufacture for or sell to that school or institution 16 prison-made articles or products; [or] a private vendor that contracts with the 17 (3) 18 department under Chapter 495 to manufacture for or sell to that private vendor prison-made articles or products; 19 (4) an employee or retired employee of a state agency, 20 21 as defined by Section 2052.101, to sell to that employee or retired employee prison-made articles or products; or 22 (5) a private school or a visually handicapped person 23 24 in this state to manufacture Braille textbooks or other

3 SECTION 3. Section 497.025, Government Code, is amended by 4 adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as follows:

5 (d) The board shall adopt rules and develop best practices 6 governing the purchase of articles and products under this 7 subchapter by a private vendor that contracts with the department 8 under Chapter 495, provided that:

9 (1) the articles and products may be shipped or used 10 only in this state and may not be resold or transferred to another 11 facility in this state that is not operating under a contract with 12 the department at the time of the transfer; and

13 (2) the office may not sell articles and products to a 14 private vendor if the private vendor currently purchases the 15 articles or products from a private business that has its primary 16 place of business in this state.

17 (e) The board shall:

18 (1) for the purpose of verifying compliance with this 19 subchapter, require a private vendor described by Subsection (d) to 20 identify the businesses with whom the vendor currently purchases 21 the same or similar items for the preceding 12 months before placing 22 an order with the office; and 23 (2) report any savings realized by a private vendor 24 described by Subsection (d) under this subchapter to the

25 legislature in the department's annual fiscal year review.

26 (f) The board shall adopt rules governing the purchase of 27 articles and products under this subchapter by an employee or

The rules must provide that articles and products may be shipped and 2 used only in this state and may not be resold. In adopting the 3 rules, the board shall determine: 4 5 (1) the articles and products available for purchase; (2) the minimum quantity or price of an order; 6 7 (3) the delivery and production schedule; and 8 (4) any other factors relevant to ensuring that the office is not impeded in effectively meeting the purposes of this 9 10 subchapter. SECTION 4. Section 497.028, Government Code, is amended to 11 read as follows: 12 Sec. 497.028. CATALOGS. The office shall prepare catalogs 13 14 that accurately and completely describe articles and products produced under this subchapter. The office shall send copies of the 15 catalogs to all state agencies and make the catalogs available to 16 17 political subdivisions, private vendors that contract with the department under Chapter 495, and employees and retired employees 18 19 of state agencies, as defined by Section 2052.101. SECTION 5. Not later than August 31, 2016, the Texas Board 20 of Criminal Justice shall adopt rules as required by Sections 21 497.025(d) and (f), Government Code, as added by this Act. 22 23 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
