7	Sec. 21.012. RETALIATION BASED ON BIBLE INSTRUCTION
8	PROHIBITED. (a) In this section, "employment action" means an
9	action that affects an employee's compensation, promotion,
10	demotion, transfer, work assignment, or performance evaluation.
11	(b) A school district may not suspend or terminate the
12	employment of a teacher or take other adverse employment action
13	against the teacher based on the teacher's instruction to students
14	about the Bible if the instruction is provided in accordance with
15	the United States Constitution, federal law, the Texas
16	Constitution, and state law.
17	(c) A teacher whose employment is suspended or terminated or
18	who is subjected to an adverse employment action in violation of
19	this section is entitled to:
20	(1) reinstatement to the teacher's former position or
21	an equivalent position;

- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
