A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to providing training academies for public school teachers who provide reading instruction to students in prekindergarten 3 through grade three. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 21, Education Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 21.4552 to read as follows: Sec. 21.4552. TEACHER LITERACY ACHIEVEMENT ACADEMIES. (a) 8 The commissioner shall develop and make available literacy 9 achievement academies for teachers who provide instruction to 10 students at the prekindergarten, kindergarten, or first, second, or 11 third grade level. 12 (b) A literacy achievement academy developed under this 13 section must include training in effective and systematic 14 instructional practices in reading, including phonemic awareness, 15 phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, and research-based 16 practices to address the needs of students with reading disorders. 17 (c) The commissioner shall adopt criteria for selecting 18 teachers who may attend a literacy achievement academy. In 19 adopting selection criteria under this subsection, 20 the commissioner shall: 21 22 (1) include teachers, including special education 23 teachers, who instruct students with reading disorders; and 24 (2) require granting a priority to teachers employed

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by school districts in which 50 percent or more of the students enrolled are educationally disadvantaged.

3 (d) From funds appropriated for that purpose, a teacher who 4 attends a literacy achievement academy is entitled to receive a 5 stipend in the amount determined by the commissioner. A stipend 6 received under this subsection is not considered in determining 7 whether a district is paying the teacher the minimum monthly salary 8 under Section 21.402.

9 <u>(e) On request of the commissioner, regional education</u> 10 <u>service centers shall assist the commissioner and agency with</u> 11 <u>training and other activities relating to the development and</u> 12 <u>operation of literacy achievement academies.</u>

13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
