- relating to occupational licenses for military service members, 2
- military veterans, and military spouses. 3
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 55, Occupations Code, as
- amended by Chapters 66 (S.B. 162) and 348 (H.B. 2254), Acts of the 6
- 7 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is reenacted to read as
- follows: 8

- CHAPTER 55. LICENSING OF MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, MILITARY 9
- VETERANS, AND MILITARY SPOUSES 10
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 55.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 55.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 14 (1) "Active duty" means current full-time military
- service in the armed forces of the United States or the Texas 15
- 16 military forces, as defined by Section 437.001, Government Code, or
- similar military service of another state. 17
- 18 (2) "Armed forces of the United States" means the
- army, navy, air force, coast guard, or marine corps of the United 19
- States or an auxiliary service or reserve unit of one of those 20
- branches of the armed forces. 21
- "License" means 22 (3) a license, certificate,
- 23 registration, permit, or other form of authorization required by
- law or a state agency rule that must be obtained by an individual to 24

- 1 engage in a particular business.
- 2 (4) [(1-a)] "Military service member" means a person
- 3 who is on active duty [currently serving in the armed forces of the
- 4 United States, in a reserve component of the armed forces of the
- 5 United States, including the National Guard, or in the state
- 6 military service of any state].
- 7 $\underline{\text{(5)}}$ [\frac{\text{(1-b)}}{\text{}}] "Military spouse" means a person who is
- 8 married to a military service member [who is currently on active
- 9 duty].
- 10 $\underline{(6)}$ [$\frac{(1-c)}{}$] "Military veteran" means a person who has
- 11 served on active duty and who was discharged or released from active
- 12 duty [in the army, navy, air force, marine corps, or coast guard of
- 13 the United States, or in an auxiliary service of one of those
- 14 branches of the armed forces].
- 15 $\underline{(7)}$ [$\underline{(2)}$] "State agency" means a department, board,
- 16 bureau, commission, committee, division, office, council, or
- 17 agency of the state.
- 18 SECTION 3. Section 55.002, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 55.002. EXEMPTION FROM PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO RENEW
- 21 LICENSE. A state agency that issues a license shall adopt rules to
- 22 exempt an individual who holds a license issued by the agency from
- 23 any increased fee or other penalty imposed by the agency for failing
- 24 to renew the license in a timely manner if the individual
- 25 establishes to the satisfaction of the agency that the individual
- 26 failed to renew the license in a timely manner because the
- 27 individual was serving as a military service member [on active duty

- 1 in the United States armed forces serving outside this state].
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 55.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 55.003. EXTENSION OF LICENSE RENEWAL [CERTAIN]
- 5 DEADLINES FOR [ACTIVE DUTY] MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS [PERSONNEL].
- 6 A military service member [person who holds a license, is a member
- 7 of the state military forces or a reserve component of the armed
- 8 forces of the United States, and is ordered to active duty by proper
- 9 authority] is entitled to one year of [an] additional [amount of]
- 10 time [, equal to the total number of years or parts of years that the
- 11 person serves on active duty_r] to complete [÷
- 12 [(1) any continuing education requirements; and
- [$\frac{(2)}{(2)}$] any [$\frac{\text{other}}{(2)}$] requirement related to the renewal
- 14 of the military service member's [person's] license.
- SECTION 5. Section 55.004, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 55.004. ALTERNATIVE LICENSING [LICENSE PROCEDURE] FOR
- 18 MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, MILITARY VETERANS, AND MILITARY SPOUSES
- 19 [SPOUSE]. (a) A state agency that issues a license shall adopt
- 20 rules for the issuance of the license to an applicant who is a
- 21 <u>military service member, military veteran, or military spouse</u> [the
- 22 spouse of a person serving on active duty as a member of the armed
- 23 forces of the United States] and:
- 24 (1) holds a current license issued by another
- 25 <u>jurisdiction</u> [state] that has licensing requirements that are
- 26 substantially equivalent to the requirements for the license in
- 27 this state; or

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- 1 (2) within the five years preceding the application
- 2 date held the license in this state [that expired while the
- 3 applicant lived in another state for at least six months].
- 4 (b) [Rules adopted under this section must include
- 5 provisions to allow alternative demonstrations of competency to
- 6 meet the requirements for obtaining the license.
- 7 $\left[\frac{(c)}{c}\right]$ The executive director of a state agency may waive any
- 8 prerequisite to obtaining a license for an applicant described by
- 9 Subsection (a) after reviewing the applicant's credentials [issue a
- 10 license by endorsement in the same manner as the Texas Commission of
- 11 Licensing and Regulation under Section 51.404 to an applicant
- 12 described by Subsection (a)].
- 13 (c) In addition to the rules adopted under Subsection (a), a
- 14 state agency that issues a license may adopt rules that would
- 15 <u>establish alternate methods for a military service member, military</u>
- 16 veteran, or military spouse to demonstrate competency to meet the
- 17 requirements for obtaining the license.
- SECTION 6. The heading to Section 55.005, Occupations Code,
- 19 as added by Chapter 66 (S.B. 162), Acts of the 83rd Legislature,
- 20 Regular Session, 2013, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 55.005. EXPEDITED LICENSE PROCEDURE FOR MILITARY
- 22 <u>SERVICE MEMBERS, MILITARY VETERANS</u>, AND MILITARY SPOUSES.
- 23 SECTION 7. Section 55.005(a), Occupations Code, as added by
- 24 Chapter 66 (S.B. 162), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular
- 25 Session, 2013, is amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) A state agency that issues a license shall, as soon as
- 27 practicable after a military service member, military veteran, or

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- 1 military spouse files an application for a license:
- 2 (1) process the application; and
- 3 (2) issue $\underline{\text{the}}$ [a] license to $\underline{\text{an}}$ [a qualified military
- 4 spouse] applicant who qualifies for the license under Section
- 5 55.004 [holds a current license issued by another jurisdiction that
- 6 has licensing requirements that are substantially equivalent to the
- 7 licensing requirements in this state].
- 8 SECTION 8. Section 55.005, Occupations Code, as added by
- 9 Chapter 348 (H.B. 2254), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular
- 10 Session, 2013, is redesignated as Section 55.008, Occupations Code,
- 11 and amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 55.008 [55.005]. APPRENTICESHIP REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 13 APPLICANT WITH MILITARY EXPERIENCE. (a) Notwithstanding any other
- 14 law, if an apprenticeship is required for a [an occupational]
- 15 license issued by a state agency, the state agency shall credit
- 16 verified military service, training, or education that is relevant
- 17 to the occupation toward the apprenticeship requirements for the
- 18 license.
- 19 (b) The state agency shall adopt rules necessary to
- 20 implement this section.
- 21 SECTION 9. The heading to Section 55.006, Occupations Code,
- 22 is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 55.006. RENEWAL OF EXPEDITED LICENSE ISSUED TO
- 24 MILITARY SERVICE MEMBER, MILITARY VETERAN, OR MILITARY SPOUSE.
- 25 SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 26 to an application for an occupational license or renewal of an
- 27 occupational license filed on or after January 1, 2016. An

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- 1 application for a license or for license renewal filed before
- 2 January 1, 2016, is governed by the law in effect immediately before
- 3 the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect
- 4 for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 11. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 6 over another Act of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015,
- 7 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 8 codes.
- 9 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
